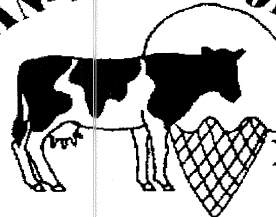
The West Granville Congregational Church will be conducting an Antique, Craft and Flea Market on October 6th and 7th 2012, 9-5 each day.

Children tire more quickly, become bored, and can be a distraction for the adults. Many experts recommend including children when you've narrowed your search to three or four choices. If arranging for a baby sitter is not feasible, try looking at only a few homes on any one day and avoid a marathon of viewing houses. Also remember that many homes you'll be looking at are not "child proof". Most sellers and their agents will make an effort to remove obvious hazards, but steep staircases, pools, stone walls, etc. are areas that can cause concern for parents. Your efforts could reduce the stress level and increase the enjoyment for all concerned

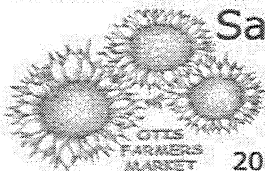
