Alexander Lafrance, son of Gary and Diane Lafrance, is spending the summer working as a member of the research team in the laboratory of molecular microbiologist Dr. Vanessa Sperandio.

The recipient of a research fellowship at the University of Texas-Southwestern Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences in Dallas, Alex is investigating the relationship between food type and virulence gene expression in enterohemorrhagic Escherichia coli (E. coli) bacteria. Using E. coli knockout mutant strains, Alex is assessing the bacteria's preference for the different food types it might encounter in vivo under a variety of growth conditions, and the influence food type and growth condition have on virulence gene expression.

Alex, a senior at Haverford College in Haverford, Pennsylvania, is majoring in cellular & molecular biology with a focus on molecular microbiology and microbial pathogenesis.

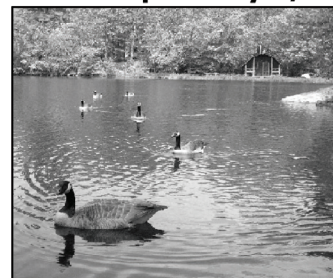

Applesauce Cake

1 cp softened butter 1 cp sugar
3 ½ cp all purpose flour 2 eggs
1 tsp baking soda pinch of salt
1 tsp cinnamon 2 tsp ground cloves
2 tsp nutmeg 1 cp chopped walnuts
2 cps raisins 2 cp unsweetened applesauce

In mixing bowl, cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy, add eggs, beat well set aside. Sift flour, baking soda and spices, reserve ½ cp and add nuts and raisins, set aside. Add remaining flour mixture to creamed mixture alternately with applesauce mixing well fold in nut mixture. Pour into a greased and floured 10 inch fluted tube pan Bake at 350 for 65 to 75 minutes or until cake tests done when wooden pick is inserted near center, cool in pan 10 minutes removing to a wire rack cool completely.

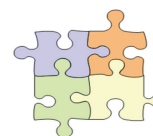

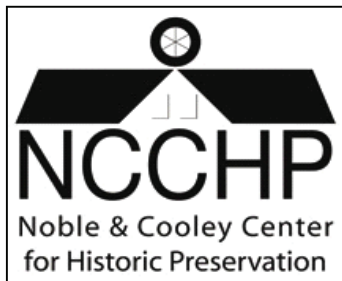

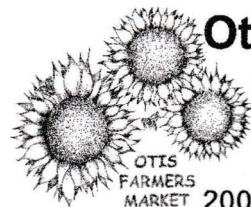
September 20th from 10 – 4 – Antiques Appraisal Day with Knotty Pine Antiques

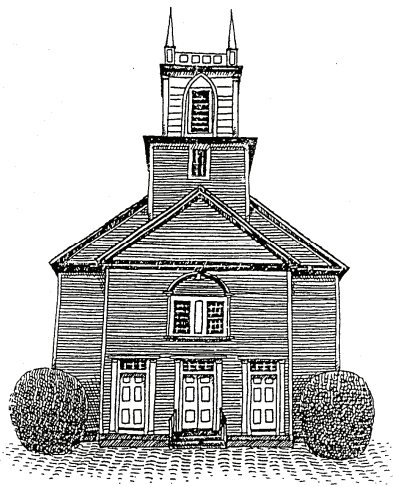

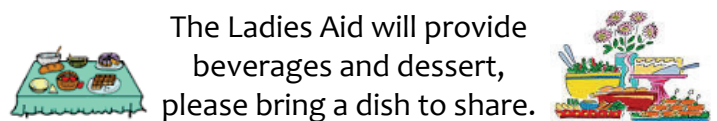
