Dog Licenses

If you have not registered your dog, please do so by either calling me for a form or stopping into the town hall. All dogs that are six months of age or older must be licensed annually under M.G.L. Ch. 140. An updated proof of rabies vaccination is required prior to licensing as well as proof of spaying and neutering. Fee for a spayed or neutered dog is \$5. Fee for an unaltered dog is \$15. A late fee will be charged \$20. It is the owner's responsibility to register their pets by April 15th.




A 'SALAD CELEBRATION'




