



The NCCHP Museum at the Drum Factory in Granville is please to announce that they are open for tours on the 2^{nd} and 4^{th} Sundays of the month from noon – 3:00PM. Join us for an informative guided visit to the local factory that started as a toy manufacturer that went on to produce drums for the

Civil War, two US Presidents and many well-known modern drummers as well. So cool!

The museum has also scheduled more Living History programs for 2022. The August 17th performance at 6:30PM features musician Jeff Snow presenting the "Softer Side of Celtic". The program combines music, stories and a wee bit of history from Scotland, Ireland and England that promises to keep the audience on the edge of their seats. Light refreshments will be served after the performance.


