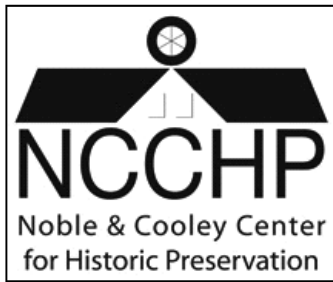

Winter Roads Policy Town of Granville, MA

- On-street parking is prohibited until May 1st. Vehicles will be towed at the owner's expense.
- During winter road treatment operations, main roads will be given priority.
- Plowing, shoveling or blowing snow onto or across Town roads is illegal.
- Granville is the source of public drinking water supplies for several communities. It limits the use of salt as a deicer.
- During winter conditions residents should limit travel and proceed with extreme caution.
- When a snow emergency is declared, residents should limit travel to emergencies.
- Residents are encouraged to use tires with snow tread between October 1st and May 1st.
- Extra travel time should be allocated to compensate for slower travel speeds during winter conditions.
- Town Roads, or sections thereof, with low use patterns may be closed for winter maintenance. This allows road clearing resources to be used more efficiently. Alternate routes will be maintained. Wildcat & Cobble Mountain Road will not be maintained and are closed to vehicular traffic.

COMMUNITY PRESERVATION NEWS

DECEMBER 2012

The Community Preservation Committee (CPC) will begin holding monthly meetings starting on December 13, 2012. The November meeting had to be cancelled at the last minute. Beginning in January, the CPC will meet at 7pm on the 3rd Thursday of each month until April at the Town Hall unless posted otherwise.

There are new rules for application criteria. The new rules allow for more options that we had in past years. The new criteria will be presented at the Dec. 13, 2102 meeting. That meeting will be held at Town Hall beginning at 7:30 pm.

Applications for 2013 funds are available at the Town Hall and online at TownofGranville.net. The application is in the process of being updated but the format is the same. Please feel free to use the current info to complete the application.

Groups or individuals who want to apply for possible funding of CPA projects should fill out an application and plan to attend one or more of the committee's meetings to answer questions about their project and/or receive help in completing the application. **The Deadline for completed applications is January 31, 2013.** The committee will be available to discuss needed revisions after that date, but please complete the application by the deadline.

Funds are potentially available for projects related to historical preservation, open space acquisition, recreational facilities and community housing. Please check with the CPC to see if your project will qualify for funding.

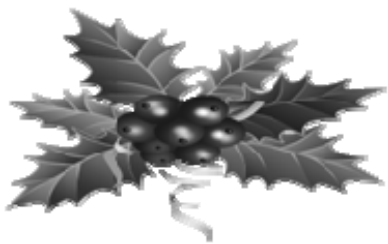

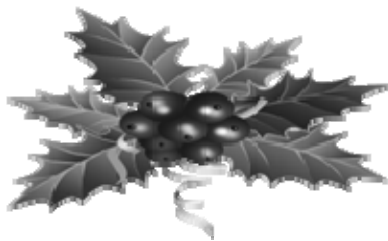

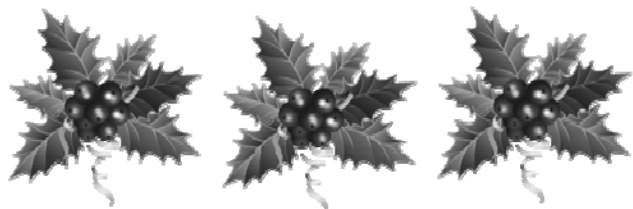

Home Safety Checklist

Fall Prevention

People age 65 and older are especially vulnerable to falls and fires in the home. This checklist can be used by older adults to check their homes for hazards. It can also be used by a home health care worker, visiting nurse, volunteer, relative, or friend to help an older adult identify hazardous situations in the home, discuss possible solutions, and reinforce fall and fire prevention messages.

EXERCISE

Do you exercise regularly?

Exercise regularly to build your strength and improve balance and coordination. Ask your doctor or other health care provider about the best physical exercise for you.

TAKE YOUR TIME

Do you rush to answer the phone or doorbell?

Take your time. Being rushed or distracted increases your chance of falling. Get out of chairs slowly. Sit a moment before you get out of your bed. Stand and get your balance before you walk.

CLEAR THE WAY

Are there tripping hazards (i.e. papers, books, electrical cords, shoes) on the floor in walking areas and stairways?

Pick up the clutter. Always keep objects off the stairs to avoid tripping.

In winter, are sidewalks, outdoor steps, and walkways clear of ice and snow?

Keep the walkways clear. If needed, ask for help with snow and ice removal.

LOOK OUT FOR YOURSELF

Have you had your eyes checked?

See an eye specialist once a year. Poor vision can increase your chance of falling.

Do you have night lights along the path between your bedroom and bath?

Night lights are the cheapest and easiest way to light the way.

Do you turn on the lights before you use the stairs?

You need to have light switches at both the top and bottom of your stairs. If needed, ask for help

installing new light switches. Never climb stairs in the dark.

Does every room have a light switch that can be reached from the doorway?

If not, ask for help installing new light switches.

SLIPPERY WHEN WET

Are there non-slip bath mats in bathtubs and showers?

Use non-slip bath mats to prevent slips and falls.

Do you have grab bars in tubs, showers, and near all toilets?

Grab bars should be installed in all bathrooms. (Easy-to-install, inexpensive grab bars are available to install over the side of the tub.) Never use a towel rack or shower rod for support.

Do you wipe up spilled liquids right away?

Spills make your floors slippery; even a few drops of liquid or grease can be a slipping hazard.

THROW RUGS CAN THROW YOU

Do your throw rugs have rubber, non-skid backing?

Use only throw rugs with non-skid backing. Smooth out all wrinkles and folds in your rugs and carpets.

Is your carpeting puckered, wrinkled, torn, or worn?

If so, ask for help repairing or replacing the carpeting.

TREAD CAREFULLY

Are there sturdy, easy-to-grip handrails on both side of the stairs?

If not, ask for help securing loose handrails to the wall, or installing new handrails along the full length of both sides of the stairs.

BEST FOOT FORWARD

Do you wear high heels, loose shoes, or slippers?

Wear sturdy, well-fitted, low-heeled shoes with non-slip soles. These are safer than high heels, thick-soled athletic shoes, slippers, or stocking feet.

Do you take any medications?

Have your doctor or pharmacist review all of your medications, including over-the-counter drugs. Some medications can affect your balance and coordination.

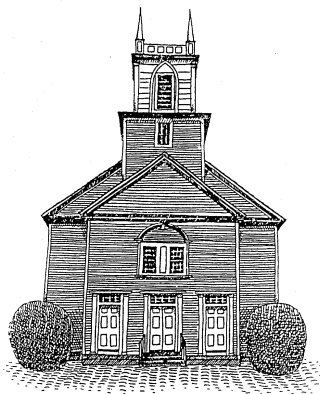

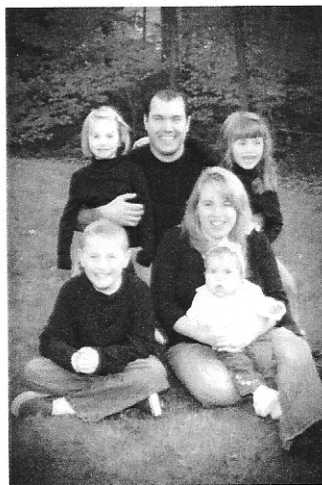

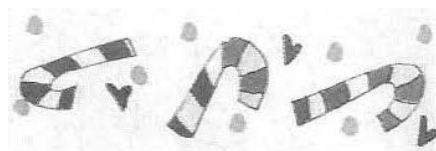
