## **Grilled Cheese & Tomato Soup Bake**

### Ingredients

3 ounces reduced-fat cream cheese

1-1/2 teaspoons dried basil, divided

12 slices Italian, sourdough or rye bread (1/2 inch thick)

6 slices part-skim mozzarella cheese

6 tablespoons butter, softened

1/2 cup tomato paste

1 garlic clove, minced

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon pepper

1-3/4 cups 2% milk

2 large eggs

1 cup shredded Italian cheese blend or partskim mozzarella cheese

### **Directions**

Preheat oven to 350°. In a small bowl, mix cream cheese and 1 teaspoon basil until blended; spread onto six bread slices. Top with mozzarella cheese and remaining bread. Spread outsides of sandwiches with butter. Arrange in a greased 13x9-in. baking dish.

In a small saucepan, combine tomato paste, garlic, salt, pepper and remaining basil; cook and stir over medium heat 1 minute. Gradually whisk in milk; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, uncovered, 4-5 minutes or until thickened, stirring frequently. Remove from heat.

Whisk eggs in a large bowl; gradually whisk in a third of the milk mixture. Stir in remaining milk mixture; pour over sandwiches. Sprinkle with Italian cheese blend.

Bake, uncovered, 25-30 minutes or until golden brown and cheese is melted. Let stand 10 minutes before serving.

#### Census

The Town Clerk's Office has sent out the 2019 Annual Census forms. Please respond within 10 days of receiving your form. If you have your mail sent to a post office box and did not receive a form, call or stop in for a form to complete.

### **Dog Licenses**

The census package also included a dog license application for dog owners on record. All dogs that are six months of age or older must be licensed annually under M.G.L. Ch. 140. An updated proof of rabies vaccination is required prior to licensing as well as proof of spaying and neutering. Incomplete applications will be returned to the sender.

### **Nomination Papers**

Nomination papers for candidates running for town offices are available at the Town Clerk's office for the annual town election to be held April 8, 2019.

Candidates for town office must obtain at least 30 signatures of registered voters town wide. The last day to file nomination papers with the Board of Registrars is February 25, 2019.

The following slates of office will be on the April ballot: one Selectman for three years, one Moderator for one year, one Assessor for three years, one Library Trustee for three years, one

Constable for three years and one member of the Planning Board for three years.

If any resident has questions pertaining to the census form, the dog license form or nomination paper you may call the Town Clerk's office for assistance. Forms may be returned by mail or hand delivered to the Town Clerk's office.

### **Annual Town Election/Registered to Vote**

If you are not registered to vote and want to vote in the Annual Town Election April 8, 2019 the last day to register is March 20, 2019.

### **Notary Public**

The Town Clerk, as well as the Town Administrator/Matt Streeter are Notaries Public. If you need our services, please call either of us and make an appointment. The service is free of charge to Granville residents. Please note Notary Services are provided as a courtesy.

A Notary does NOT give legal advice.

The following are REQUIRED in order to be provided with Notary Services:

- The document CANNOT already have been signed
- All signers MUST be PRESENT at time of notarizing
- The Notary is stating they have WITNESSED the document being signed
- The person(s) signing MUST provide a proper photo ID

The document MUST contain the appropriate Notarial Statement (Clause) - NO EXCEPTIONS ... Types of Notary: Jurat (statements are true) OR Acknowledgement (ones free act). The certificate MUST contain the oath given by notary to identify the type of notary act.

We do not notarize copies of original documents - NO EXCEPTIONS

We reserve the right to deny notarial services based on circumstances, if the above-mentioned policies are not followed or if documents are incomplete or if documents are in a format that is unacceptable to this office or if the documents do not have the notarial clause/statement.

Welcome to the story of Woodlands Cemetery, Granville's little country cemetery on the shores of Degano Pond. We'd like to share with you some of the ongoing work to preserve and safeguard the cemetery as well as some items of historical interest.

Woodlands is in a quiet corner of Granville on Blandford Road. It is 203 years old with plenty of character and lots of history. Check out some of the familiar

names: Cooley, Barnard, Gibbons, Rose, Stow, Seymour, Roberts, Shaughnessy, and Bancroft.

Maintaining such a cemetery takes some tender loving care. Many of the oldest stones are marble, thin and fragile. Newer ones are granite and long-term durable.

This past autumn Liberty Hill did some substantial tree work to prevent risky trees and branches from damaging headstones. The toppled Seymour stone from 1877 was righted by Smith Monuments and we are attempting to repair the fence around the Cooley family plot. This winter we will apply for Community Preservation funds to repair and secure broken and hazardous stones.

<u>Historically</u>, we'd like to introduce you to Woodlands first resident, Alsop Paine Stow. It was his grandfather Elihu Stow who donated the land for Woodlands probably due to the death of his grandson Alsop in 1816. Elihu reserved a small section for their family. It is located on a knoll in the front row near the southwest corner.





The inscription reads:
The ground in this yard
Was first opened to receive
the body of
Alsop P. Stow
son of Alva &
Lucy Stow who
died Feb 2, 1816
aged 3 yrs 10 mos
Here lies our little son
within
Free from sorrow & from sin
Lent to us for years & hours
And then cut down
like\_\_\_\_\_

In later years, Woodlands became the home to many soldiers from the Revolutionary War forward to WWII



and on. According to the Stiles family genealogy, John Stiles enlisted as a minuteman in 1774, serving under Capt. Lebbeus Ball. His equipment consisted of a musket, bullet pouch, powder horn, knapsack, hatchet and blanket. To be ready, he attended all drills and exercises which were taught by British deserters. He eventually became a sergeant. They were called into action on April 19<sup>th</sup>, 1775 (now known as Patriot's Day) in response to the fight in Lexington and Concord and were stationed in Boston at Gore House. Later in the war he served at Ticonderoga and Bennington. During a short respite back in Granville in 1776, he married Ruth Roberts of Middletown, CT at Pynchon's Hotel in West Granville. They had 5 children. He died in 1835 at the age of 84. Ruth, known in Granville as "Granny Stiles", received a pension for John's war service and died 15 years later at the age of 94/95.

Well, we could go on and on but we'll have to save some items for future Caller editions. We'd love to hear from you.

#### 2018 in Review

During the year of 2018, the Granville Fire Department responded to a total 196 calls for Service, combined medical and fire. This is right in line with prior year.

We welcomed new member Nate Sinland (FF), and formally launched our Rehabilitation team with new members Lisa Rickis, Maggie Pratt, Daniele DeMay, Nicole Berndt, and Gabe Alfano joining the department. Two members also attended Firefighter 1 Training, and three attended Firefighter 2 Training. In addition, 1 member completed EMT training, while six others trained and will be completing testing in 2019.

We put our new "Squad 1" truck into service, and collected over 350 toys for our Toys for Tots initiative in a great partnership with the Granville PD.

2018 also saw the return of the loaded baked potato and chili booth at The Harvest Fair!

Our dedicated volunteer members each also logged approximately 150 hours of training during the year.
