WINTER ROADS

The winter of 2023-24 is upon us and all Granville residents should take note the following winter weather road maintenance concerns:

On-street parking is prohibited. Vehicles are subject to removal at the owner's expense.

Parking at the Town Hall, Library, Village School, Center Fire Station, and West Fire Station is restricted to those doing Town business during business hours.

Plowing, blowing, or otherwise depositing snow on Town roads is prohibited.

Trucks conducting snow and ice control travel at slow speeds and may maneuver unpredictably.

For the safety of all please use caution and courtesy in the presence of maintenance vehicles and pass only when safe.

Despite continual ice and snow control during winter precipitation, all roads are periodically subject to hazardous conditions. Please avoid all non-essential travel.

Beware of shaded areas prone to early freeze-up or black ice that can become hazardous even on blue sky days. Notorious for this are the "gorge", "hairpin turn", the north end of Old Westfield Road, and Water Street between the Transfer Station and Trumble Lane.

Winter sand is available at the Highway Garage to residents of Granville. Sand is not available during winter weather operations when large trucks and heavy equipment are maneuvering in the limited yard space. During this time entering the Highway Department Facility is prohibited.

Highway crews appreciate your cooperation and patience when winter weather strikes. For more information, contact the Superintendent of Public Works at 357-8585 extension 6.

Nomination papers for candidates running for town offices will be available at the Town Clerk's office for the annual town election to be held Monday, April 8, 2024. If you wish to run for a position within our municipality in April, please call the office and we can either meet via appointment or I can mail you a nomination paper for completion. New candidates for town offices must obtain at least 30 signatures of Granville registered voters. The last day to file nomination papers with the Board of Registrars will be February 23, 2024 at 5:00PM.

The following slate of offices will be on the April 8, 2024, ballot:

one member of the Selectboard for three years;

one Moderator for one year;

one Assessor for three years;

one Town Clerk for three years;

one Library Trustee for three years;

one Constable for three years;

one School Committee member for three years;

two members of the Planning Board for three years; and

one member of the Planning Board to fill unexpired remainder of term, two years

five members of the Recreation Committee for three years.

Veteran's Representative – office hours second Thursday of the month from 9-11am. Stop by if you have questions/concerns.

SHINE program provides free health insurance information and counseling to all MASS residents with Medicare and their caregivers. 

MISSIONS NEWS

So often, God's answer to our prayers and needs are already in the works before we're even aware of them. As what happened last month: We received a donation of \$500 to be sent to the Agape School for use in maintenance of the well. At about the same time, we received a panic call that authorities had closed the well because it had been contaminated due to some pipes rusting. This meant trips to the river for water, which isn't safe and is time consuming. The money was received, and the well was quickly fixed (\$450).

We are still collecting hats and mittens. We are also collecting men's and women's socks which are taken to the Samaritan Inn in Westfield.

Have COVID-19 symptoms?

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts, in partnership with Color, is offering free telehealth visits to get COVID-19 treatment pills, for those ages 12 and up.

Oral antiviral treatment is for people who have had COVID-19 symptoms for 5 days or less. Antiviral treatment may reduce the risk of severe disease and prevent hospitalization.
