

Here's what's happening at the NCCHP museum at the drum factory in July! Mark your calendars and visit soon!

Rain or shine, the NCCHP (Noble& Cooley Center for Historic Preservation) museum will be open for tours on **Thursday**, **July 4**<sup>th</sup> **from**11:00 – 2:00 following the Granville parade which starts at 10:00 AM. Visit the Historic Room and then check out the all new train and trolley exhibits in the renovated factory museum space. Tours are free for NCCHP members, \$5 for adults and \$3 for children under 12 for non-members.

New this year – a "Build Your Own Drum" option for \$15 that includes a tour of the museum, a cord and ear drum kit and instructions on how to "string" your own drum. Fun and challenging\* for all ages. (\*Note: museum members will be onsite to assist with the stringing process.)

On Wednesday, 7/10 at 6:30, the free monthly Living History series features a patriotic musical program titled "Lincoln and Liberty – Music of the Civil War Years" led by Roger Lee Hall. Mr. Hall is a music preservationist, author and composer and holds a Ph.D. in Musicology specializing in early American music. Abraham Lincoln was a lover of all kinds of music. This multi-media program includes music and pictures from Lincoln's years as the U.S. President with the audience invited to sing along with several of the well known Civil War

tunes.

Free Monthly Movie Night on Wednesday, July 24<sup>th</sup> from 7:00 – 9:00 will continue featuring short movies on trains and trolleys to complement the newest museum exhibit "Trains and Railroads", as well as short films on other historic topics. Come take a step back in time and learn about the history of trains and how they grew and moved this country from the 1830's through the current day.

The NCCHP museum at the Drum Shop is located at 42 Water Street in Granville and is **open for tours on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays of the month from 12:00 – 3:00**. # Invitation from Granville, Ohio

My name is Thomas Hankins. I am from Granville, Ohio. I am a member of the Hocking Valley Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution. On July 20th 2013 at 2:00pm inn conjunction with the Granville Historical Society we are having a Grave Marking Ceremony for Sgt. Timothy Rose. Timothy was from Granville, Massachusetts. Sgt. Rose lies at eternal rest in the Old Colony Burying Grounds here in Granville. He was born June 1st, 1762 and died November 27, 1813. Timothy entered service to our country at the young age of 13 when he and his brothers were called up with the Massachusetts Militia on April 20th, 1775. He served with several militia companies as well as the 4th Connecticut Regiment, the 15th Massachusetts Regiment and the 4th Massachusetts Regiment. He was discharged on October 22nd, 1783 having attained the rank of Orderly Sergeant. After the war Timothy came to the Ohio territory. In 1804 he formed The Licking Company and brought about 60 settlers from Granville, Massachusetts and established Granville, Ohio. Timothy was a respected Deacon of the Church and eventually became one of Licking County's first Judges. We would like to formaly invite the citizens and governing body of the town of Granville to attend this important ceremony. Thank you for your time and kindest consideration on this important ceremony.
