

Green Committee Pavilion

On Wednesday November 13^{th,} the Green Committee met to discuss



building a pavilion on the pad at the Green. When the walkway was installed the pad was added so someday it could be the base for a pavilion. We are excited to start this project and asked to meet with the Select Board on Monday November 18th. Joe Pietroniero and Amos Carpenter presented what we had in mind. The Select Board were all in favor of the pavilion, they had several questions and some suggestions. The size would be 30X24, with a peaked roof all four sides will be open so as not to obstruct the view through the Green. There will be electricity and lighting for safety. The posts will start with stone pillars, then post and beam. As we formulate the plans, we will again meet with the Select Board and Bob Sullivan. This is a work in progress we will keep all informed through meetings and the Country

Caller. We have always wanted a pavilion on the Green, but it took Joe to set things in motion!

A separate account has been set up to accept donations for this project. Rosy Campbell, Marjanne Nobbs and Mary Beth Sussmann have recently donated. We now have \$2265.00 set aside for this project. Thank you all who have donated. This is a great start for this project, we anticipate the cost to be about \$6000.00. Anyone wishing to donate money send a check to the Town Hall indicating it is for the pavilion. Due to circumstances beyond our control we have put the building on hold for the time being and hope to have it up and useable for the summer of 2021.

We know this will be a wonderful addition to our already beautiful Green and hope to have this built and ready for use before the July 4th2021 Celebration. 
We have been made aware that the Agape School that we help to support in Uganda is experiencing health issues with some of their livestock. Please pray for them with us.

Woodlands Cemetery Update and History

Our cemetery efforts continue. Although the Community Preservation Act application for Woodlands was declined for this year due to more compelling needs, the applications for West Granville (1 stone), Main Road and Northeast cemeteries were partially approved and we plan to go forward with them as soon as possible. We will continue all efforts for next year.

THIS MONTH IN GRANVILLE HISTORY

JULY

July 8, 1711 - Samuel Bancroft, Granville's first settler, is born in West Springfield, Massachusetts.

<u>July 13, 1713</u> - The boundary between the Province of Massachusetts Bay and the Colony of Connecticut is settled.

<u>July 7, 1756</u> - At Kensington, England, at a meeting of the King and his Council, "Colonial law incorporating Granville as a District was approved and ratified". This completely finalizes the incorporation that was passed here in America on January 25, 1754 when the name was changed from Bedford to Granville.

July 4, 1776 – The Declaration of Independence is adopted. ---->

<u>July 6, 1780</u> – With the pressing needs of the War for Independence, the Town votes to give a bounty of 6£ or 20 bushels of wheat to every man enlisting.

<u>July 26, 1781</u> – For the first time in the records of Granville, "dollars" is used as a denomination for payment as the town votes to give 10 silver dollars to 3-month soldiers. British currency was seriously devalued.

July 16, 1803 - Otis Dickinson marries Malinda Bancroft. ----->

<u>July 4, 1812</u> – A petition is sent to Congress from Granville stating opposition to the War of 1812. The Congress had declared war against Great Britain the prior month. The war ends in Feb 1815.

July 1, 1816 – 3 bushels of corn sells for \$3.00.

July 1, 1864 – Cyrus Ives purchases a pair of pants for \$2.00.

July 2, 1869 – It is declared that highway workers in Granville are to be paid 15 cents per hour.

<u>July, 1886</u> – The town votes to build a schoolhouse in the Northeast (Old Westfield Road) district of Granville. It was the last district-serving school built in Granville.

July 11, 1887 – Miles Rose sang at the funeral of Cynthia Noble at the Baptist Church.

July 18, 1888 - Mr. Peck mowed 3 acres, for Miles Rose, with a "machine" (the first mention of a machine).

<u>July 15, 1909</u> – The West Granville Post Office closes after 91 years of Service at the West Granville (Benton) store.

<u>July 10, 1913</u> – Thomas Jensen rescues a woman and 2 children in a runaway horse-drawn carriage in Westfield. He dies from serious injuries several days later. He is recognized by the Carnegie Hero Fund.

<u>July 6, 1914</u> –The Woodlands Cemetery Association minutes report that the Town of Granville has voted to transfer its interest in the cemetery on Blandford Road (Woodlands) to the Association.







Woodlands Cemetery Update and History Cont'd

July 1, 1927 – Construction of Cobble Mountain Reservoir begins.

July 12, 1930 – The first edition of the Granville Center News, a precursor to the Country Caller, is published.



<u>July, 1931</u> – The Drum Shop replaces steam with electricity to run its machinery.

<u>July, 1932</u> – The tarring of Granby Road, from the Library to North Granby begins, financed by the state, county and town with work being done by Granville citizens.

July 19,1935 - A Raspberry Shortcake Supper was held in West Granville. Adults 35¢, children 15¢ and 20¢.

July, 1937 – The First Church of Christ in Granville and Granville Baptist Church join together to form the

Granville Federated Church.

<u>July, 1950</u> – Dressed appropriately for the occasion, the Granville Library Club celebrates the 50th anniversary of the construction of the Library .



<u>July 4, 1964</u> – Clara Kolb Drummer, age 83, walks away from a Fourth of July picnic on Jeff Miller Road in Tolland and is never found.

Mid-July, Every Year - Blueberry season begins.

<u>July 4, 2020</u> – Happy Independence Day and Month!


OBITUARY
