




Summer Fire Safety Tips from The Granville Fire Department!

Summer has finally arrived and so have all the fun and exciting outdoor activities that come with it. As the nice weather arrives there will be more outdoor cookouts, beach trips, campfires, and many more. Our job on the fire department is to ensure you take a moment to understand and realize the risks that summer brings. Now with that being said here are a few tips to help you stay safe this summer.

- Your grill should be approximately ten feet away from your house. Grills are a primary cause of house fires in the summer. This can be prevented by regularly cleaning your grill, keeping it a safe distance from your house and checking the propane periodically for leaks.
- When working in the heat remember to drink water and stay adequately hydrated.
 Inadequate hydration can lead to things such as headaches, fatigue, heat exhaustion and in severe cases heat stroke.
- After mowing your lawn, you should allow your lawn mower cool before storing it inside.
 There has been an uptick in house fires due to lawn mower malfunctions and it has been
 recommended that you allow it to cool outside away from any structures in the event of a
 fire. Additionally, you can help prevent fires by regularly checking your lawn mowers oil, any
 electrical connections and by regularly cleaning it.
- With the summer we understand people will be having more outdoor fires. We would like to recommend that you keep them to a 3-foot by 3-foot space. We also recommend you avoid the use of accelerants to avoid any injuries or fires burning out of control.
- Our last tip of the evening is to check the batteries in your flashlight. With the summer we
 can see an increase in severe thunderstorms which can lead to power outages. In the event
 of an outage, you should have functioning flashlights. You can also purchase emergency
 lights that plug into your outlets and come on when the power goes out.

We hope that you will all take a second to read these tips and implement them into your daily lives. While they may sound silly by taking a few moments to adhere to these tips you are both working to making a safer environment for you, your friends, and your families. Now we hope that you all have a safe and wonderful summer. Most importantly the fire department would like to wish the entire town of Granville a Happy Fourth of July.



WOODLANDS CEMETERY UPDATE: NOW A CREMATIONS-ONLY CEMETERY

In November 2020, multiple unmarked graves were discovered in diverse locations throughout the cemetery. They were in the "newer" section of the cemetery that was thought to have been unused up to that point. There was no option at that time except to close the cemetery to casket burials and pause the selling of new sites while still honoring cremations only for those sites already owned.

After some research and review of options, it has been determined that the GPR (Ground Penetrating Radar) technology that is available to identify potential unmarked graves is not within our financial resources and not definite enough to pursue.

Therefore, Woodlands is now <u>permanently</u> a cremations-only cemetery and we are confident that we can open the cemetery for the sale of new cremations-only sites for now and the foreseeable future. Sites remain as 10 ft x 4 ft and can accommodate up to 4 cremation burials. Sites are \$650 each and will increase to \$700 in 2023.

(Moore) Sussmann, he attended the West Granville School through 8th grade and graduated from Westfield High School in 1956.

Ted then took up agriculture on the family farm, Hillcrest Farm in Granville. He got his start with two Brown Swiss cows, Phyllis and Phoebe, that he bought interest free through the Frank Atwood WTIC radio program. From January 1962 – October 1963, he proudly served his country in the United States Army where he was stationed at Redstone Arsenal in Huntsville, AL.

On a fateful trip to the Dude Ranch in Tolland, Ted asked a pretty girl, Ann, to dance and then proposed on their 4th date at the Goshen Fair. That was a bit too quick for Ann but after two years of dating, Ted married the love of his life, Ann B. Curtiss on July 8, 1967.

Besides his work on the farm, he worked for the Massachusetts Turnpike at the Blandford Depot doing road maintenance from 1988 – 1999. Always one for agriculture, Ted rose very early to work on the landscape crew out of Boston for many years on the Turnpike. He retired to dedicate his time to haying and growing blueberries on the farm. In his spare time, Ted enjoyed snowmobiling and was a member of the Granville Lions Club, West Granville Cemetery Committee, as well as a member of the Granville Team on the Southwick Grange Card Club.

To cherish his memory, Ted leaves his beloved wife Ann; his children Theodore R. Sussmann, Jr., Jeanne A. LeFebvre and Timothy C. Sussmann; his grandchildren Erin M. Sussmann, Lauren E.
