## **Upcoming Bridge Construction & Road Closures**



There will be 3 bridge repair projects that will occur this summer & fall in town: Alder Brook Bridge over Borden Brook Rd., Ripley Brook Bridge over Beech Hill Rd. and Hollister Brook Bridge over Old Westfield Rd.

The projects began with Alder Brook Bridge on Borden Brook Rd., which will be closed for several weeks. The construction on Ripley Brook Bridge will follow and may be concurrent with Alder Brook Bridge. The construction on Hollister Brook Bridge will not begin until late summer or early fall.

## Report of JUNE 9<sup>th</sup> Senior Services Meeting

The June 9<sup>th</sup> Senior Services meeting was very well attended. Selectperson Nicole Berndt presented a Power Point of possible services. This was followed with a creative and lively discussion of possible services. Members of the Granville Fire Department and Highland Valley Elder Services were a welcome presence.

Nate Sindland of the Granville Firefighters told attendees about Safety and Security items that will help them locate and assist residents in Emergency situations. These items include reflective numbers for house identification, lock boxes for house keys for quick access, packets for quick identification of medical status displayed on your refrigerator and help with smoke detectors and battery changes. If you are interested and in need of this assistance, contact the Fire Department at 413-357-8572, ext 2. Valerie D'Aquisto and Jenn Murray of Highland Valley Elder Services spoke about the many services Highland Valley can provide including discussing options for home care and health services, chores, counseling, etc. They will be returning for a more detailed discussion soon. Here is a list of possible services identified by meeting attendees. Please note the list is not in order of priority.

- Transportation: Identify transportation concerns and possible solutions, formulate plans for use of the Town van.
- Research a "Buddy program"/ "Neighbor to neighbor" system
- Social Events: Movies, holiday celebrations, trips, and games
- More involvement in Town Events.
- Closer involvement with Granville youth, possibly through music and nature, in coordination with programs at the Library.
- Classes: Yoga, Art, Crafting, Computer
- Work closely with the Granville librarian in planning events
- Identify ways to expand Food accessibility: Meals on Wheels, expand use of Southwick Food Pantry, possibly build on "Lunch Bunch" monthly lunches at the Church with speakers, provide information about CSA shares.
- Increase awareness and utilization of the Public Health Nurse who visits Town
- Aesthetician Services, including podiatry.

The following were identified by attendees as priorities: Food Services, the "buddy program", transportation and accessibility concerns, social events and classes to include connecting to youth.

Dorothy Mae Dalrymple was born January 17, 1930, in Westfield MA. She grew up in Woronoco, a small "mill town" in the town of Russell with her mother Florence Ellis and father David Dalrymple along with her sister Marjorie and brother David. She loved growing up there and had fond memories of her youth. After she graduated from Westfield High School, she met Joseph W. LeClair at a party in Granville. Soon they married and moved into Joe and Edna LeClair's house on North Lane #2. They built a house down the road for their growing family Linda, Jay (JWL jr) David and Robert. Family was important to them, they camped, skied, they played and worked together, scooping blueberries in family blueberry lots. Dorothy taught Sunday school, was a Girl Scout leader, she was on the Council on Aging, and volunteered for many years at a cancer center.

Because Dot and Joe were such an integral part of each other's lives it Is hard to separate one from the other when it comes to their journey through life. When retired, they went south to visit the Everglades. Dot and Joe parked their Motor Home and worked there for two seasons. They were always interested in wherever they were and soaked up all the knowledge the area had to offer.
