GARDEN TIME

Western MA Master Gardeners held soil testing clinics & Q&A mornings on May 4th & June 1st @ the Town Hall.

If you missed it, we will plan another this autumn. pH testing will be done again. Fall season is the perfect time to prepare your soil for the coming spring. Improper soil pH can "lock up" nutrients. In the meantime.....

This summer you can start a compost pile! Recycle your plant materials & vegetable scraps, transforming them into humus & mulch. Organic matter added annually to your gardens conditions the soil, adding structure. Sustaining fertile soil will aid in holding water, nutrients & encourages micro-organisms & earthworms to enhance growth of healthier plants.

COMPOSTING IS EASY:

You can buy a bin, or make your own from wire mesh. OR SIMPLY delegate an out of the way spot of your backyard to pile up leaves & organic debris. The rate of decomposition can be hastened by turning the pile with a pitchfork (aerating). Keep the pile damp, but not wet & soggy. Only a damp pile will decompose. If you hear dry crunchy leaves...it's too dry. Mix & layer the materials. After every 12" or so, add a few shovelfuls of rich soil or compost. UMass studies found "compost activators" had no effect on the rate of composting.

Ingredients:

ADD 3 PARTS " BROWN": (high in carbon): fall leaves, straw, salt marsh hay, shredded paper, newspaper & cardboard, chipped brush, saw dust, & pine needles (not more than 10% of the pile)

and.....1 PART "GREEN": (high in nitrogen): vegetable & fruit waste, dry grass clippings, weeds (not laden with seeds or those that spread by runners), crunched up eggshells, coffee grounds (earthworms love them!), teabags, manure from horse, cow, rabbit, chicken, gerbil or goat (no dog or cat poop!)

Wait a few months, or wait until next spring.....black gold!

The first 25 Granville adults (age limit is 16 and older) to enroll will be accepted into the workshop, so call soon to reserve a place in the class.

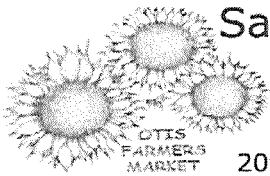

CLIENT ELIGIBILITY POLICY

Our Community Food Pantry will provide services to residents in the towns of Southwick, Tolland and Granville as of January 1, 2012. To be a client of the food pantry you will need to provide the following and meet with our staff.

Identification Verification: MassHealth or other insurance card, EBT card, bank/debit card, or referral from other social service agency (food stamps/SNAP, AFDC, WIC, Welfare, Medicaid, SSI, Head Start, Fuel Assistance or Veteran's Aid)

Proof of Residence: Utility bill, bank statement, lease/rental agreement, car registration or request to post office with address change with street address and will be checked to town street listing book from census completed by residents

Proof of Household Size: MassHealth card or other insurance card for each, childcare payments, school registration for children, landlord verification/affidavit of number listed on lease/rental agreement, marriage license, tax return, or birth certificates.

Income Verification: MassHealth card, EBT card, any governmental aid benefit statement or last year's tax return.*
