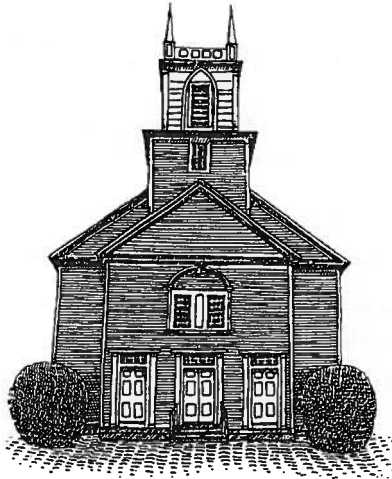

## **A word from the Granville Ambulance Association**

When 911 is called, we want to respond to your call for help as fast as possible. Response time can be critically delayed when your residence is not clearly marked with a reflective house number. Valuable minutes are lost when emergency services have to search for the right house.

In this Caller is the form to order a house number sign from the Granville Ambulance Association. The signs are large, reflective at night and are sold at a discounted price. All proceeds from house number sign sales benefit the ambulance.

Whether you order a sign from the Ambulance Association or provide your own, please make sure your house is clearly marked:

Place a number on your house and if you have long driveway one visible from the road.

If several homes use a common driveway, clearly post the numbers for each house at the beginning of the driveway.

If your mailbox is on the same side of the road as your house, attach the sign to your mailbox. If your mail box is across the street from your house, attaching it to the mailbox may confuse first responders.

While many of your emergency responders know exactly where Ore Hill is, or West Mountain, or exactly which house was the old Gibbons house, or the old Cooley law office, knowing your house number and having it clearly posted, is the best way to save valuable minutes.

## **In Your Garden Now**

June continues to be a busy month in your perennial beds. Continue completing all the chores you did not get done in May.

Take care to give extra moisture to flowers growing beneath trees/shrubs; it helps to compensate for competition from the tree/shrub roots. Also mulching helps soils retain moisture.

### WEED WEED WEED

Planting, transplanting, dividing continues throughout June. Keep new plants well watered and add compost to each plant. WEED - WEED - WEED. A simple way to make and add your own compost is to dig a hole about 12" deep anywhere in your garden (watch for roots of plants) add kitchen waster i.e. vegetables, fruit scrapes, egg shells, coffee grounds to about 6", tamp down, add back the soil you dug out, smooth it out and move on to another spot. You can also blend the fruit & vegetable scrapes & egg shells in your blender and add directly to the soil. I have used this method very successfully for many years. Continue weeding!

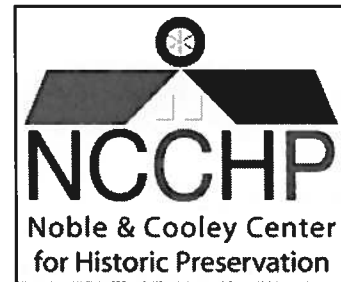

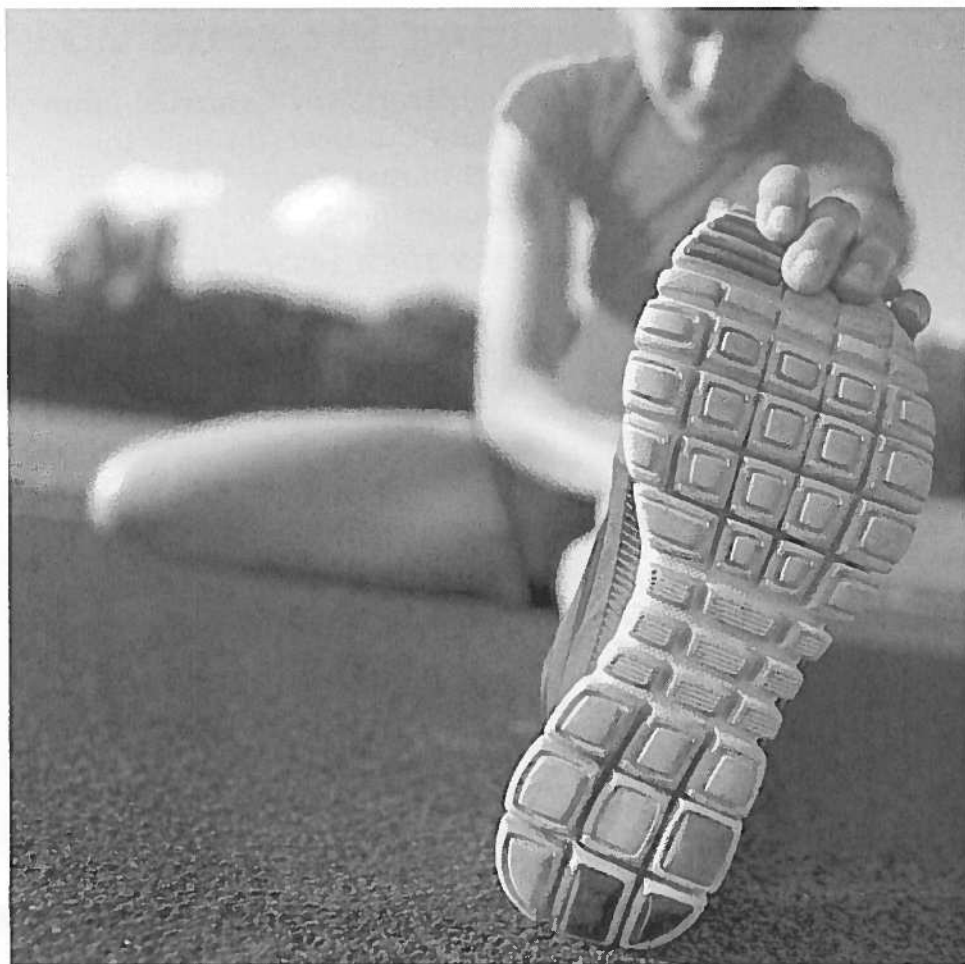

### MIKE YOUNG HONORED WITH WAITE AWARD FOR ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICE

WESTFIELD, Mass. (6/2/14) – The Westfield River Watershed Association is pleased to announce that it has chosen long-time board member Mike Young as the 2014 winner of the Richard A. Waite Award for his outstanding environmental service. The Waite Award, established in 1981, is given annually to a person who helps preserve and improve the local environment within the Westfield River watershed. Richard Waite was a former executive director of the Westfield River Watershed Association.

Since 1999, Mike Young has been a leader of the Westfield River Watershed Association, holding the posts of president, treasurer and secretary. He leads WRWA's efforts to label storm drains on the streets in the watershed to discourage dumping. He coordinated WRWA's involvement in the Atlantic Salmon Egg Rearing Program (ASERP) in local classrooms and has taken on the Trout in the Classroom (TIC) program, as well.

Young also volunteers for other WRWA events, including annual river cleanups, the annual River Symposium and Kayak Demo Day. He edits WRWA's newsletter and updates its website regularly.

He is an associate professor at Westfield State University, teaching courses in astronomy, geology and physics. His academic interests include quarternary geology, geomorphology and archaeoastronomy. He enjoys a variety of outdoor activities, including hiking, cycling, canoeing and skiing. He has hiked all 48 of the 4000-foot peaks in New Hampshire's White Mountains and all 46 peaks of the official list for the Adirondacks, plus the 35 Catskill peaks over 3,500 feet.

WRWA president Brian Conz noted that Mike is an ideal recipient of the Waite Award, bringing his "muddy boots" approach to teaching citizens and his students about the environment and inspiring new generations of watershed stewards.

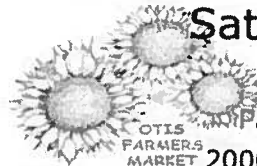
