Hours: Tuesdays 1pm-5pm and Saturdays 9am-5pm

Please help us operate your Transfer Station by following these rules:

- The punch card system is based on bag size and uses gallons as a unit of measure
 - Punch cards are \$75 each and are available at the Transfer Station and Town Hall
 - Buy a punch card according to the trash bag size you use: 13, 30, 42, or 50 gallons
 - Cost is 9¢ per gallon to dispose trash in the compactor
- Pay by check
- No loose trash
- Secure all trash in a bag with twist tie or knot
- Scrap metal is free and pertains to steel only
- For use by town residents only
- *Prohibited* items:
 - Waste oil, batteries, fluorescent bulbs, sheet rock, insulation, roofing, tile, construction demolition material
- Recycling:

ROUTE 57 SUMMER CONSTRUCTION AND REPAVEMENT

Construction and re-pavement of Route 57 will occur this Summer. Granville was awarded a one million-dollar MassWorks grant to repair drainage, mill, and repave the section of Route 57 from Sodom Street to Jensen Lane and Route 189 to the Water Street intersection. Replacement of the retaining wall on Granville Hill is also scheduled.

Work will begin in June. Milling and repaving are planned for September. Anticipate delays and detours due to single lane zones. The Granville Police will be directing traffic for this project. For everyone's safety, please drive slowly. We appreciate your patience and will minimize delays.

This year's construction is part of a multi-year plan to repair and repave all of Route 57. Most of the drainage is 70 years-old and it is a priority to replace it. In 2006, the Granville Gorge was paved and in 2015 the western section between Jensen Lane and Dead Man's Corner was completed.

The MassWorks grant was important for financing this year's project. The next phase is to apply for federal Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) funding to finish Route 57 on the western end of town.

An informational presentation regarding the Route 57 project and TIP application process will be held on Monday June 6th and June 20th at 7:00pm in the Town Hall.





OBITUARIES

Carroll John McGorty

Cal, age 93, died peacefully in his home in Westfield MA on April 15, 2016. Born in Springfield MA on April 27, 1922, to Rollin and Effie McGorty, Cal and his sister Shirley spent their childhood in upstate New York. After graduating from Amenia New York High School, he served in the U.S. Army during WWII as a tank commander in the 4th Armored Division under Gen. George Patton. He was awarded the Purple Heart Medal for wounds received in combat when his tank was attacked. While being flown to an Army hospital in England, he was shot down by enemy troops and had emergency surgery in a tent in France. Immediately back into combat, his battalion was on the front lines defeating Germany and liberating Czechoslovakia, and was awarded the Presidential Citation.

Cal was a talented artist and one of his first art assignments was to paint the company B mascot "Bugs Bunny" on the tanks. Following his military service he graduated from Vesper George School of Art in Boston. Cal pursued a career in art and graphic design. He was the Director of Design and Development for Warner Brothers Packaging in Bridgeport, CT. that merged with Rexham Corp. from which he retired in 1987. During his career, he was awarded for his achievements in packaging design from accounts such as Clairol, for designing hair color boxes that took color printing to a new level of precise color matching, and Poloroid for inventing packaging that extended the expiration date of film. He was also instrumental in developing the design of the bar code that is now used on most packaging. After retiring, Cal followed his passion for art by painting watercolor and oil paintings to sell out of his barn that he converted into an art gallery in Granville, MA, where he had owned a home for over 50 years and raised 4 children by his first wife. He loved Granville and was active in community events including the annual Harvest Fair, where the art gallery was transformed with fall festivities of cider making and gospel bands. Through the gallery he made friends from all over the Country who proudly collect his work.

Cal married Anne Wischan in 1983. They lived in Milford CT. and commuted to Granville on weekends.

Cal was also passionate about Bible study and was active in several churches including most recently the Sratford (CT) Baptist Church. He had a strong faith in God and maintained a scholarly study of the Bible. Many friends looked to him for spiritual guidance. He also continued working as a business consultant to friends and family – including assisting with marketing for his son Daniel in his music store in Westfield and providing the art and design for his daughter's start up magazine, the Real Estate Guide for Martha's Vineyard. Cal was well loved with a great sense of humor. He will be missed by many. He is pre-deceased by his son Jeremy McGorty of Webster, NY. He is survived by his sister Shirley Lucia of Southwick, MA; his wife Anne McGorty of Westfield MA; son David McGorty & wife Carlene of Holliston MA; son Daniel McGorty & wife Patti of Granville MA; daughter in law Bonnie McGorty of Webster NY; and his daughter Ruth McGorty of San Diego CA, Jonathan McGorty, Matthew McGorty (wife Mimi) & Timothy McGorty of Charlotte NC, Melissa Anthony of Detroit MI (husband James) Christina Tyler (husband Wyatt) of Southwick MA, Nathan McGorty & Joshua McGorty of Granville MA, Kevin McGorty of Boston, MA, Erin McGorty of Webster NY Great grandchildren: Carmela & Valentina McGorty, Daniel & Rayna McGorty, Cordelia & Lyle Anthony, Wesley Tyler.


