GRANVILLE FIRE DEPARTMENT 709 MAIN ROAD

The Granville Fire Department wants you to stay safe this grilling season!

Many people enjoy barbecuing in the summer months. But when grills are not used safely, things can go horribly wrong. In the past several years, Massachusetts fire departments responded to 431 fires involving grills, hibachis, and barbecues. These fires caused 20 civilian injuries, three firefighter injuries, and \$3.5 million in property damage.

Here are some tips for grilling safely:

- Grills should never be used on a porch, balcony or deck with a roof, overhang or wall.
- Place grills away from the house and deck railings.
- Make sure that the lid of a gas grill is open when you light it. Propane can build up inside and when ignited, the lid may blow off.
- If you smell gas while cooking, turn off and get away from the grill. Call 911 from a safe location. Do not move the grill.
- Always turn off the burners and close the propane cylinder when done cooking. Never leave a burning grill unattended.
- Propane storage: store cylinders upright in an outdoor, shaded area; do not leave cylinders in a vehicle.

Are you ready to grill?

- Check that all connections are tight before turning on the gas.
- Leaks can be detected by dabbing the connections with a solution of soapy water and turning on the gas momentarily. If bubbles occur, there is a leak that must be fixed before the grill is used.
- Clean the grease trap every time you grill.
- Replace propane cylinders that are old, rusty, or showing any other signs of disrepair.

Charcoal Grills

- Use only charcoal starter fluid. Gasoline and kerosene should not be used to start a fire in a grill. Never add lighter fluid to burning briquettes or hot coals. Doing so may cause a flash fire and result in serious burn injuries.
- Charcoal briquettes give off carbon monoxide, a colorless, odorless gas that can be deadly. Always use charcoal grills in a well-ventilated area. Never use charcoal grills indoors.
- For proper disposal of grill ashes, allow the coals to burn out completely and then cool for 48 hours before disposal.
- If you must dispose of ashes before they are completely cooled, thoroughly soak them in water before putting them in a metal container.



Doug, age 63 of Winter Haven, FL died in Bonita Springs, FL April 25, 2017.

Douglas was born October 19, 1953 in Springfield, MA, the son of Milton and June (Briggs) Hansen, of Fort Myers, Fl. Doug grew up in Granville, Ma. and was a truck driver for many years. He was predeceased by his brother Jeffery Hansen. He is survived by his wife Jane, daughter Mary Hansen and her husband Frank of Fort Myers. Douglas will be greatly missed.

Edward "Ed" Cooley Roberts

Ed, age 91, passed away peacefully on April 25th, 2017. He was born in Granville to the late Ralph and Mary (Hansen) Roberts. Ed was a graduate of Westfield High School and enlisted in the U.S. Air Corps during WWII. After his service, he attended the University of Massachusetts and went to work for Kaman Air Craft. Ed went on to be the owner of Roberts' Hillside Orchard, a family farm since the 18th century. He served his community as town meeting Moderator, chaired the Planning Board, was a police officer, and the President of the Mass Fruit Growers Association. Ed loved the miracle of watching things grow. He is predeceased by his wife of 56 years, Barbara (Hull) Roberts and his brother, Lenny Roberts. He leaves his daughters, Christine Jette and her husband Bill of Suffield, CT, Natalie Speicher and her husband Charlie of Manahawkin, NJ, and Valerie Roberts-Toler and her husband Printice of Worcester; his sons, Edward Roberts, Jr. and his wife Karen of Southwick, and Doug Roberts and his wife Nancy of Granville; 11 Grandchildren; and 8 great-grandchildren. Ed also leaves his companion, Nancy Clark of Lenox, MA.

Lottie (Jaworski) Massai

Lottie, age93, (1923-2017) devoted wife of 54 years to the late Elmer Massai; and the oldest living resident in the town of Granville, passed away May 1, 2017 peacefully at her home, surrounded by her loving family.
