# GET VACCINATED = REMOVE MASK REQUIREMENT

As of May 29, 2021 the Commonwealth of Massachusetts face covering order will be rescinded and replaced with current CDC guidance which allows for all vaccinated individuals to be unmasked except in a very few situations i.e. hospitals, long-term care facilities and K-12 schools. All gathering limits will also be rescinded. Unvaccinated individuals will still be required to be masked in public. The Council on Aging has a few Knox Boxes still available for Granville Seniors. These Knox Boxes securely hold house keys to allow emergency services such as police, fire and ambulance gain access to your house in the event of an emergency. The Fire Department will install the boxes. The boxes are provided **FREE** of charge to seniors 55+ who request them on a first come first serve basis. If there are no other seniors interested, then the remaining purchased Knox Boxes will be offered to Non-Seniors on a first come-first serve basis for a subsidized cost of \$50.00 per unit. # REFLECTIVE ADDRESS MARKERS



# **Easy Enchilada Casserole**

- 1 can mild enchilada sauce
- 1 jar medium salsa
- 6 flour tortillas, burrito size
- 1 can (or bag frozen) corn
- 1 can black beans, rinsed
- 1 can pinto, cannellini, or great northern beans, rinsed
- 4 cups shredded cheese (I use mild cheddar and a Mexican blend)

Customize it with precooked chicken or ground beef, diced tomatoes, etc.

Preheat oven to 350F. In a large bowl, mix the beans, corn, salsa, and any other add-ins. In a buttered 13x9 glass baking dish, place two tortillas, cover with about half the bean mixture, and sprinkle with cheese. Repeat layers, then finish with a third layer of tortillas and cheese. Drizzle the enchilada sauce over the top. Bake 30 minutes, until bubbly.
