Census

Thank you to those of you who have returned your census forms either with noted corrections or confirmation that there are no changes at your residential address. If you still haven't returned your census, please do so as soon as possible. Failure to respond to the mailing shall result in removal from the active voting list and may result in removal from the voter registration rolls.

Dog Licenses

Many folks have either stopped into town hall or via mail requested to license their dog(s) for 2018. There are still many on record who have not, so this is a friendly reminder to do so before May 1; otherwise, there will be a late fee of \$20/dog. For the safety of all dogs in town we maintain a list of all licensed dogs as well as dogs on record that veterinarians have advised us have their rabies vaccination, but may not be licensed. The census package included a dog license application for dog owners on record to license their dog. For first time licensing of your dog(s), you may go to the Town web site and print a form to complete. You may also call, request a form via mail, email or stop by the Town Hall. All dogs that are six months of age or older must be licensed annually under M.G.L. Ch. 140. An updated proof of rabies

vaccination is required prior to licensing as well as proof of spaying and neutering. Incomplete applications will be returned to the sender.

Marriage Intentions

If you wish to marry, you may contact my office or any other Town Clerk in the Commonwealth. The first document that a couple must complete is the Marriage Intentions Form and both must be present at the same time to do so. Following this, a license is issued and you can be married any place in the Commonwealth. Your marriage license is filed at the Town Clerk's Office where the Marriage Intentions Form is completed. The GFD is looking for volunteer members to staff our Rehabilitation team. The rehabilitation team is an all volunteer team responsible for providing support to Firefighters, Police, EMS or other town personnel during major incidents or training events. Some responsibilities include:

- Obtaining, transporting, and providing food, water, warmth, and cooling throughout long lasting events such as fires or large training scenarios or incidents.
- Taking basic vital sign information for Firefighters, working in partnership with on site EMTs and taking appropriate actions.
- Participating in quarterly prep meetings to discuss and review rehab readiness.
- Providing general support to Firefighters and Police as needed during incidents and events.

Clothes Dryer Safety

In 2016, there were 100 dryer fires that caused two civilian injuries, eight fire service injuries, and \$2.7 million dollars in property damage. Almost half of the fires, 47%, occurred in 1- and 2-family

homes.

Clean the Lint Filter After Every Load

Remember to clean the dryer filter screen after each load of laundry, to clean the outside vents twice a year and to occasionally vacuum the motor area of the dryer. If materials such as cooking oil, solvents and other combustible or flammable liquids were not removed completely during the laundry cycle, heat from the dryer may cause them to ignite. This is the reason that mop heads should not be put into the dryer. An adult should be at home whenever the dryer is in use and the home should have working smoke alarms.

Dryer Fires Prevention Tips At-A-Glance:

- Clean the filter screen after each load to prevent lint buildup, which can cause fires.
- Stay home when the dryer is in use.
- Clean the vents to outside twice a year to clean out any accumulated dust and lint.
- Vacuum the motor area. The dust and lint in the vent area can ignite if it gets hot. You may need to remove a panel in order to get to the motor area.
- Commercial dryers should be cleaned out regularly because of their frequent use and shared venting system.
- Don't dry mop heads in the dryer! The dryer's heat can ignite the chemical residue on mop heads.
- Keep the surrounding area clean. The dryer's heat may ignite anything left too close to the dryer.

Together, we can improve the life safety and well-being of our Granville residents!

Granville Historical Room Historical Photo Digitization Project

The Granville Historical Room, located in the Public Library at the corner of Route 57 and Granby Road, is looking for your old Granville photos and documents!

What is the Historical Room looking for?

Old pictures of people, places and events in Granville. "Old" means whatever you think is interesting and worth sharing. For example, pictures of the Blizzard of 1978. Or a family picture from 1878.

What is the process?

1. Simply drop off up to 10 pictures during library hours. You will be asked to complete a short form describing each picture (when, where, who, etc.) and your photos will be placed in an envelope. The forms will also ask for your permission to add the images to the Historical Room's on line archives. You will be given a copy of the forms as a record of what you dropped off.
2. Digital images of the photos will be created in the Historical Room and posted on the Historical Room's on line collection.
3. You will be notified that your originals are ready to be picked up. You will then be able to download your digitized files from the Historical Room collection at <https://historicalroom.omeka.net/>
4. The process should take between 2 and 4 weeks depending on interest level.
5. If you have more than 10 pictures you can always drop off future batches. If things are slow we might be able to handle more than 10 per batch.

Other Questions:

1. Is there any cost? No. This is a volunteer effort.
2. Will any picture be accepted? Usually. If a photo is similar to something already in the collection or has no particular relevance to Granville people, places or events it may be skipped.
3. Are digital images accepted? Yes. If you have images that are already in digital format or which you have digitized and are of high quality, they are welcome. Recent digital images should be of the type that will be of interest to Granville residents in the future; for example, the 4th of July parade, Harvest Fair, family reunions, etc.
4. How Are The Photos Safeguarded? Photos will not leave the library and will be kept in the Historical Room. The library and Historical Room cannot be responsible for loss or damage to your photos but all reasonable care and precautions will be exercised.
5. Can Photos Be Donated? Yes, if you wish to donate your original historical photos they are welcome.

Recipe of the month

Roasted garlic Sweet Potato Mash

3 sweet potatoes, peeled and cubed

8 cloves garlic, roasted

1 tblsp olive oil

¼ cup vegetable broth (chicken will do also)

½ tsp salt

¼ tsp black pepper

In a large pot, cover the potatoes with water and bring them to a boil. Boil until the potatoes are soft when pierced with a knife, about 15 minutes. Drain in a colander and return the potatoes to the pot. Add garlic, olive oil, broth, salt and pepper. Mash with a potato masher or fork.

(Omit the roasted garlic and add 1 tblsp peeled and grated fresh garlic and 1 tblsp honey to the mash) serves 4

Our Community Food Pantry has received a grant to set up a mobile food pantry to reach families from Granville and Tolland who are unable to get to the Pantry.

Every Wednesday the van will come to the Tolland Public Safety Complex, 206 West Granville Rd, from 1 to 1:30 PM and at the Granville Town Hall Complex, 707 Main Road for 1:45 to 2:15 PM. If school is canceled due to weather the van will not operate.

Our Community Food Pantry provides food to individuals and families experiencing food insecurity. Our Mission is to feed the hungry in the three towns of Southwick, Granville and Tolland, never turning away a family in need. We provide weekly allocations of food to families and individuals based on a needs assessment. In general, if a child receives free or reduced-price lunches at school the family is eligible for assistance from the pantry.

The Pantry's main office in Southwick is open on Monday from 3 to 5; Tuesday and Wednesday from 10 to noon; and Thursday from 5 to 6.
