

Dog Licenses

Still some dog(s) have not been licensed for 2019. This is a friendly reminder to do so before May 1; otherwise, there will be a late fee of \$20/dog. For the safety of all dogs in town we maintain a list of all licensed dogs as well as dogs on record that veterinarians have advised us have their rabies vaccination, but may not licensed. The census package included a dog license application for dog owners on record to license their dog. For first time licensing of your dog(s), you may go to the Town web site and print a form to complete. You may also call, request a form via mail, email or stop by the Town Hall. All dogs that are six months of age or older must be licensed annually under M.G.L. Ch. 140. An updated proof of rabies vaccination is required prior to licensing as well as proof of spaying and neutering. Incomplete applications will be returned to the sender.

<u>Census</u>

Thank you to those of you who have returned your census forms either with noted corrections or confirmation that there are no changes at your residential address. If you still haven't returned your census, please do so as soon as possible. Failure to respond to the mailing shall result in removal from the active voting list and may result in removal from the voter registration rolls.

Marriage Intentions

If you wish to marry, you may contact my office or any other Town Clerk in the Commonwealth. The first document that a couple must complete is the Marriage Intentions Form and both must be present at the same time to do so. Following this, a license is issued and you can be married any place in the Commonwealth. Your marriage license is filed at the Town Clerk's Office where the Marriage Intentions Form is completed. Vital Records

Birth records are filed based on residence. If you are a resident of Granville at the time of the birth of your child, then the child's birth certificate will be filed in Granville. Death records are filed in the community in which you pass away. Certified copies of vital records (Birth, Marriage, Death) are \$10.00.

2018 NEWSLETTER

On behalf of all the volunteers and scholarship recipients of the Granville-Tolland Dollars for Scholars®, our heartfelt thanks to all patrons and sponsors for their generosity in supporting the Chapter's ongoing work. We are pleased to share our activities over the past year.

Scholarships were awarded to 25 undergraduate students from our two towns, totaling \$25,000 in 2018-2019. Scholarships are based upon merit, incentive and history of community service.

Our on-line application, located on our website, Granville-Tolland.dollarsforscholars.org, provides access for students to apply for scholarships conveniently and from any location. Applications will be open until May 1, 2019.

The 2018 Mail-a-thon generated \$12,499.20, and with other fundraising efforts from our towns raising \$748 (Harvest Fair proceeds, etc.), a total of \$14,010.49 was added to this year's available scholarship funds.

Scholarships were provided, honoring the following creators of our permanent endowment: Dorothy Miller, Jane & Stuart Watson, Everett O. and Miriam T. Rockwell, Walter A. and Katherine E. Phelon, 1st Lt. Travis Fuller, Elizabeth Meiklejohn Memorial Endowment, the Robert & Gloria Gery Endowment and The Ladies Aid Society of Tolland Honoring Bertha Fowler Hale. Benefiting from positive market performance and sound investment strategies, the endowment investment returns help to support annual scholarship funds.

The Granville Parent Association made a generous donation to support our students. These funds will go toward a named scholarship in honor of the Granville Village School for the 2019-2020 school year. The national motocross championships were held at the Southwick track in 2018. Volunteers representing Granville-Tolland Dollars for Scholars donated their time to park cars on the regional school grounds and raised over \$1,300 toward annual scholarships!

Clothes Dryer Safety

In 2017, there were 100 dryer fires that caused civilian injuries, eight fire service injuries, and \$2.7 million dollars in property damage. Almost half of the fires, 47%, occurred in 1- and 2-family homes.

Clean the Lint Filter After Every Load

Remember to clean the dryer filter screen after each load of laundry, to clean the outside vents twice a year and to occasionally vacuum the motor area of the dryer. If materials such as cooking oil, solvents and other combustible or flammable liquids were not removed completely during the laundry cycle, heat from the dryer may cause them to ignite. This is the reason that mop heads should not be put into the dryer. An adult should be at home whenever the dryer is in use and the home should have working smoke alarms. Dryer Fires Prevention Tips At-A-Glance:

• Clean the filter screen after each load to prevent lint buildup, which can cause fires.

• Stay home when the dryer is in use.

• Clean the vents to outside twice a year to clean out any accumulated dust and lint.

• Vacuum the motor area. The dust and lint in the vent area can ignite if it gets hot. You may need to remove a panel in order to get to the motor area.

• Commercial dryers should be cleaned out regularly because of their frequent use and shared venting system.

• Don't dry mop heads in the dryer! The dryer's heat can ignite the chemical residue on mop heads.

• Keep the surrounding area clean. The dryer's heat may ignite anything left too close to the dryer.

Together, we can improve the life safety and wellbeing of our Granville residents!

Welcome to the continuing story of Woodlands Cemetery, Granville's country cemetery on the shores of Degano Pond.

Winter is a quiet time as far as New England cemeteries go. But Spring will arrive again in due course with chirping birds, green leaves, and probably the usual threat of a Spring snowstorm.

In the update category, we have applied for Community Preservation Act funds with the town committee and expect to hear later of their decision. Approval will mean that we can repair some broken stones and secure others that are dangerously loose.

Historically.... buried in Woodlands is Timothy Mather Cooley, (1772 - 1859) an important figure in the town for more than 60 years. He was a pastor, an educator, a member of most of the church councils in the area, and a trustee and later vice-president of Williams College. He inspired many young Granville men to pursue college. He was the son of Capt. William Cooley who led a company in the Revolutionary War. He died December 14, 1859 and his headstone is central in the Cooley plot that has the fence that we are undertaking to repair. It is because of his excellent record keeping on births, marriages, and deaths that we have a great amount of genealogical information available. He married Content Chapman and raised a family at 662 Main Road in a house that still stands.

Woodlands also has many military patriots. Both James H. Gowdy and his brother Chauncy M. Gowdy served in the Civil War. In Nashville, TN, Cpl. James died from a gunshot to the side. In Cold Harbor, VA, Pvt. Chauncy received a severe thigh wound and mustered out of the military in July, 1864. They were the sons of Noble C. and Lydia W. Graves Gowdy. Chauncy was listed as a cigar maker at his enlistment. Cigar making was a viable and profitable endeavor in the early 19th century in Westfield and Granville.



The inscriptions read: James H. Gowdy Died of Wounds at Nashville, Ten. June 7, 1864 Aged 23 Member of 2 D Regt. Ohio Vol.

Chauncy M. Gowdy Died Dec 21, 1872 Age 36 Member of 10th Regt. Mass. Vol.

For those interested, Albion Wilson's book, *History of Granville, Massachusetts*, is a treasure trove of local history. It is out of print but the library has a copy and an edition can sometimes be found for sale on <u>www.abebooks.com</u>.
