WINTER ROADS

The winter of 2023-24 is upon us and all Granville residents should take note the following winter weather road maintenance concerns:

On-street parking is prohibited. Vehicles are subject to removal at the owner's expense.

Parking at the Town Hall, Library, Village School, Center Fire Station, and West Fire Station is restricted to those doing Town business during business hours.

Plowing, blowing, or otherwise depositing snow on Town roads is prohibited.

Trucks conducting snow and ice control travel at slow speeds and may maneuver unpredictably.

For the safety of all please use caution and courtesy in the presence of maintenance vehicles and pass only when safe.

Despite continual ice and snow control during winter precipitation, all roads are periodically subject to hazardous conditions. Please avoid all non-essential travel.

Beware of shaded areas prone to early freeze-up or black ice that can become hazardous even on blue sky days. Notorious for this are the "gorge", "hairpin turn", the north end of Old Westfield Road, and Water Street between the Transfer Station and Trumble Lane.

Winter sand is available at the Highway Garage to residents of Granville. Sand is not available during winter weather operations when large trucks and heavy equipment are maneuvering in the limited yard space. During this time entering the Highway Department Facility is prohibited.

Highway crews appreciate your cooperation and patience when winter weather strikes. For more information, contact the Superintendent of Public Works at 357-8585 extension 6.

Annual Census & Annual Dog Licenses

The Town Clerk's Office has sent out the 2024 Annual Census forms and Annual Dog License applications. If you have your mail sent to a post office box and did not receive a form, **PLEASE update your mailing information with me**. Also you can call or stop in for a form to complete.

All dogs that are six months of age or older must be licensed *annually* under M.G.L. Ch. 140. An updated proof of rabies vaccination is required prior to licensing as well as proof of spaying and neutering. Incomplete applications will be returned to the sender.

Marriage Intentions

If you wish to marry, you can contact my office or any other Town Clerk in the Commonwealth. The first document that the couple must complete is the Marriage Intentions Form and both must be present at the same time to do so. Following this, a license is issued and you can be married any place in the Commonwealth. Your marriage license is filed at the Town Clerk's Office where the Marriage Intentions Form is completed. 



Blood Pressure Clinic Health Resources Available

The Public Health Nurse will hold a Blood Pressure Clinic:

Tuesday, March 5 from 2:30 – 4:30 p.m. Town Hall





This is an appeal to the residents of this town to become involved. Woodlands Cemetery is in need of such involvement by folks who care about the history of the families there and the history of the town.

When the Woodlands Association was first formed 110 years ago, the plan to have a neat organization with officers and administrators overseeing all things was realized and it remained that way for many decades. But volunteers are scarce these days as most people are very busy living today's life with less interest in the past. Most folks, I think, leave town in the morning and return tired in the evening. This year we are putting forth a full-fledged effort to bring some new folks on board. We are trying to reestablish that interest and involve some people who would operate as a small group in all aspects of Woodlands.

We are looking to become a small group of 5 or 6 volunteers to work together for the well-being of this cemetery. We need people who are conscientious and responsible. The families and friends of those already buried in Woodlands, as well as the ongoing history of Granville, need that commitment. The goal is that the small group of us would participate in these tasks. Each person would eventually be able to do any task.

It's important to say that the <u>time commitment is minimal</u>, but the service to the town and involved families is tremendous. <u>This volunteer effort requires</u>, on the average, 1 hour (or less) a month.

First, we have to say that this is not a call for the physical maintenance of this cemetery. A maintenance person does the mowing and trimming as well as some Spring and Fall cleanup.

The following is a brief explanation what would be involved:

<u>February:</u> File postcard 990-N with the IRS documenting continued status of non-profit. Follow the practice from prior years.

<u>March:</u> Send a letter to the town requesting maintenance funding. The letter is simply a copy of the prior year's letter with the date changed. Cemetery funding is in the town budget.

<u>April:</u> Send invoices to the members (about 25) for their annual dues. Receive and deposit the checks.

<u>May:</u> Place flags on the graves of veterans (about 40). Hang the welcome sign and information box.

<u>Summer:</u> Send a check to our maintenance person when he mows or does other cleanup. In general, he mows once per month at the end of each month. He will call to notify that it is done.

<u>Summer:</u> If anyone is interested in buying a plot, give them a tour and allow them to choose a site. Receive the payment. Issue the deed.

<u>Summer:</u> If a burial is needed, work with the family or funeral home to facilitate it. Woodlands is now a cremation-only cemetery.

<u>Summer:</u> Accompany the monument people into the cemetery when a new stone is installed.....to be sure that they have the correct location and that they don't accidentally hit the old fragile stones already there.

<u>November:</u> Remove the veterans' flags from the cemetery right after Veterans' Day.

Winter: Nothing. The cemetery is closed from November till May.

Occasionally: Drive by and visit the cemetery occasionally to be sure all is ok.

IMPORTANT: We have a Policies and Procedures Manual which explains in detail exactly how to go about all of these things. Everything is documented and up to date.

We are more than willing to answer any question or address any concern you might have. Thank you for considering it.


