

Come meet creatures from Riverside Reptiles at our Kickoff, Ed the Wizard performing Reading is Magic (*sponsored by a generous grant from the Granville Cultural Council*), listen to a storyteller who will bring things to life in your imagination, animals and ice cream at the Gran-Val Scoop, see and touch reptiles and amphibians, and come to the library during Monday hours and make a craft.

Important Information:

- **We invite all parents and siblings to join us, but we request all children 8 and under be accompanied by an adult.**
- Write your first and last name on your Reading Log (in case you lose it!)
- If you lose your reading log, you must start over. The library does not keep a record of the reading you have done.
- To receive raffle tickets, you must ask the librarian to stamp and/or initial your Reading Log, Activity Sheet or Craft.
- Each raffle ticket earned should have the child's name (first and last) and telephone number written on it, then be placed in the raffle box of the prize they wish to win. Only one prize per child will be awarded per day.
- Four raffle prizes will be drawn at the end of each event. All the raffle tickets that are not drawn will be put in for the grand prize. You do not need to be present to win. After each raffle the next four prizes will be put out for the following event.
- This year we will award one adult prize. Adults attending any event with their child will receive one raffle ticket for the adult raffle.





Mortgage

The majority of people purchasing a home need to obtain financing. The terms of the loan are set forth in a promissory note or promise to pay, which includes such things as the original loan amount, the payment schedule, amount of each payment, the duration of the loan and interest rate among other things.

What we commonly refer to as a mortgage is actually a deed called the mortgage deed. The borrower "gives" a mortgage as collateral to the lending entity and does not "get" a mortgage.

This document gives the lender an interest in the real estate and is a lien on the property. It's also the means by which the lender can legally begin foreclosure proceedings in case of default on repayment.


