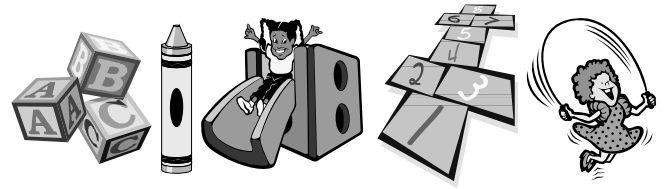

## Medicare Fraud and Abuse

Unneeded or unauthorized Medicare services costs the Medicare program – and taxpayers – money.

We ask you to check your Medicare statement (**Medicare Summary Notice – MSN**) for items or services you did not receive. The **MSN** shows what was billed, what Medicare paid and what you may owe. If you have a question or concern regarding a Medicare claim, check first with your physician, provider or supplier.

The trained volunteers of the **Massachusetts Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP)** can teach you about protecting personal information, reducing identity theft and reporting errors on your health care statements. Please contact them at Elder Services of the Merrimack Valley **1-800-892-0890** to assist with fraud and abuse concerns. Thank you.

For further assistance with Medicare issues, make a **SHINE appointment at your senior center or call 1-800-AGE-INFO (1-800-243-4636), then press or say “3”**

Once you get the SHINE answering machine, leave your name and number: a SHINE Counselor will call you back as soon as possible.

In order to be eligible for Kindergarten, a child must be ***five years old on or before September 1, 2013.*** There will be no exceptions to this policy. As required by Special Education Law, Chapter 766, screenings will be conducted in the areas of hearing, vision, speech/language, cognitive and motor skills. **All parents having an eligible child should come to the Woodland School office at 80 Powder Mill Road, Southwick, MA to pick up an enrollment packet between now and May 21<sup>st</sup>. Open enrollment hours are 9:15 am to 2:45 pm.**

A check off list is included in the packet for your convenience. Once you've filled out your paperwork and have the necessary documents (proof of residency, birth certificate, medical, physical) as noted on the check off list, **return ALL information to the Woodland School Office.** An appointment will be made for you at that time to attend the screening (June 6<sup>th</sup> & June 7<sup>th</sup>) to complete the registration process.

## COMMUNITY PRESERVATION NEWS MAY 2013

The Community Preservation Committees (CPC) recent meetings have centered on evaluating this years' grant proposals and making decisions on funding recommendations. As a result of those meetings, the CPC will bring the following proposals to the 2013 Annual Town Meeting for a vote.

- 1) Town Green Walkway - \$ 17,000.00 for replacement of the current asphalt walkway with new paver bricks. This is partial funding for the project using the new open space funding guidelines.
- 2) Historical Room Document Preservation - \$ 1,500.00 for the purchase of archival storage materials to be used for preservation of the most sensitive documents in the collection.
- 3) Old Meeting House Kitchen Roof - \$ 4,000 for new roofing material on the kitchen portion of the OMH.

During last years' funding cycle, the Town approved a grant of \$5,100.00 for an assessment of the collection of the Historical Room, located in the Granville Library. This study has been commissioned for the purposes of planning for the preservation of the documents and other items there. That 40 page report has been received from the New England Document Conservation Center and will be a major tool in our efforts to preserve the history of Granville. The report is available for anyone who would like to study it – please contact Richard Pierce at 357-6403 for a digital or print copy.

In the coming months, the CPC will be sending out information on the new funding guidelines for Community Preservation Act projects and updating the application form.

The CPC will also be actively informing residents and town organizations about the successful funding of numerous projects over the past 4 years and will be discussing the possibilities for increasing the matching state funds we receive.

The bulk of CPA funds are derived from a 1½ % surcharge on your property taxes, the rest from a state CPA fund that is funded through real estate transaction fees through the Registry of Deeds. Our state match has only been in the 18 – 25% range for the past 4 years. We would like to take steps to increase that match and will be informing residents about the possibilities.

Any proposals for a change would be presented at the 2014 Town Meeting. At this years' Annual Town Meeting, the CPC will be presenting some information on past projects and current funding levels.

Note: To see what your current CPA assessment is, look at your property tax bill. It is listed on your bill as "Spec AsmtCP cmprct" with the monetary contribution beside it.

It's not too early to begin planning for next years' projects. If you are part of an organization in Town the has a potential project in the CPA categories of Historic Preservation, Open Space & Recreation or Community Housing, please contact CPC chair Richard Pierce for more information at 357-6403.

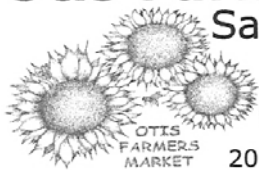

Learn about composting : Recycle your plant materials & vegetable scraps. Transform them into humus & mulch, which are valuable soil improvers.

Improve your garden soil structure this year!

We will guide you to UMass Extension Service fact sheets to give you valuable information on insects, diseases, good maintenance practices, perennials, annuals & vegetables.

We will be able to do a soil test for pH. This will guide you in the need for lime in your lawns, flower beds & vegetable gardens.

Each garden space, lawn & garden, should be tested separately.

A small donation will be accepted for cost of the test materials.

Please follow the suggestions for soil testing below:

**How do I take a soil sample for testing?**

1. Dig a hole 6-8 inches deep (3-4 inches deep for lawns) and set the soil aside
2. Using a clean trowel, take a thin vertical slice from the side of the hole and place in a clean container
3. Take at least 5 samples from the test area and mix them well in a clean container
4. Place 1/2 cup of this mixed soil in a small plastic bag, close tightly and label the outside of the bag

**Avoid taking soil which has recently been limed or fertilized.**

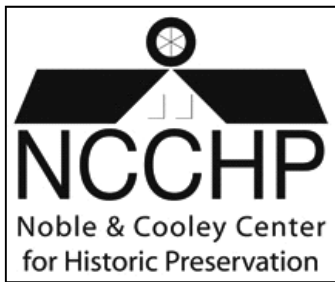
