Dog Licenses

If you have a dog(s) and I missed sending you a form, call or stop in. All dogs that are six months of age or older must be licensed annually under M.G.L. Ch. 140. An updated proof of rabies vaccination is required prior to licensing as well as proof of spaying and neutering. Incomplete applications will be returned to the sender. Fee for a spayed or neutered dog is \$5. Fee for an unaltered dog is \$15. It is the owner's responsibility to register their pets by April 15th. A late fee of \$20 will be charged beginning this month.

Business Certificates

What is a Business certificate?

Commonly known as a "DBA" ("doing business as"), a business certificate creates a public record of the name and address of the owner(s) of a business. This also includes anyone operating any type of home-based business. Consumers are entitled to this information and it may not otherwise be readily available.

Who must file a business certificate?

Massachusetts General Law Chapter 110, § 5 states that any person conducting business in the Commonwealth under any title other than the real name of the person conducting the business, whether individually or as a partnership, shall file a business certificate in the office of the Town Clerk of every city or town where an office of any such person or partnership may be situated.

Under Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 110, §6 a business certificate is not required if a corporation is doing business under any title which includes the true surname of any partner. Certain other associations and partnerships may also be exempt (refer to above citation for details.)

How do I file or renew a business certificate?

Forms are available by mail or in person at the Town Clerk's Office, 707 Main Road or by calling 413-357-8585, Ext 3. Each person named on the certificate must either sign the form in person at the Town Clerk's Office or have their signature notarized on the form by a Notary Public.

Applicants must file each of the following: an application, a certificate and a Worker's Compensation Insurance Affidavit. Please be careful to fill out all of the information on the forms completely. Filing a DBA does not protect your business name. The filing fee is \$30.00 and good for 4 years (*effective January 1, 2016*).

Does the filing of a business certificate protect me from others using the same name?

No. The protection of a trademark (word, name, symbol or device) in Massachusetts is accomplished through the Secretary of State's Office.

What if I discontinue or withdraw from the business or move to another location?

A Statement of Discontinuance, Change of Residence form must be completed and filed with the Town Clerk if one of the following occurs before the expiration:

• Business is discontinued,

• One or more persons named on the certificate is withdrawn or retired from the business or partnership,

• Change of residence of one of the named persons on the certificate, or

• One or more of the persons named on the certificate dies.

Marriage Intentions

If you wish to marry, you can contact my office (357.8585 Ext 3) or any other Town Clerk in the Commonwealth. The first document that the couple must complete is the Marriage Intentions Form and both must be present at the same time to do so. Following this, a license is issued and you can be married any place in the Commonwealth. Your marriage license is filed at the Town Clerk's Office where the Marriage Intentions Form is completed. Vital Records



Death records are filed in the community in which you pass away. Certified copies of vital records (Birth, Marriage, Death) are \$10.00.

Transfer Station News

April 2016

This year we have made many improvements to the Transfer Station to provide better service to Granville residents. The Highway Department with Bob Sullivan's help, rebuilt the decks, installed single stream recycling, and upgraded the electrical service. We also plan to pour a concrete pad between the compactors, install a new fence and gate, and replace compactor number one.

We need your cooperation with a few operational items. The card system has been in place for twenty years, but we would like to recap how it works. Trash bags are sold in various sizes using gallons as the unit of measure. The four punch card sizes are sold in accordance with the most popular plastic trash bag sizes: 13 gallons, 30 gallons, 42 gallons and 50 gallons.

All of the cards cost \$75.00, and are based on \$.09 per gallon of trash placed in the compactor. The price has not increased, and is the same price per gallon for all bag sizes.

We ask that you buy the card that corresponds with the trash bag size you use and put all of your trash in a bag secured with a twist tie or knot. It is *extremely* important that all trash be in a secured bag.


Loose trash causes problems with maintaining the compactors, safely transporting the trash, and sanitation of the transfer station. By using the bag size that corresponds with the card you purchase, it allows us to be fair to everyone and correctly charge for the volume each person brings.

Please purchase your card with a check made out to the Town of Granville.

For most, this is how business has always been done at the Transfer Station and we thank you for your cooperation. Please help us continue our operation of the Transfer Station as a clean and organized enterprise by following the rules outlined above. The Transfer Station's location next to Trumble Brook, a jurisdictional stream, makes it an environmentally sensitive area and subject to inspection by the Department of Environmental Protection. Therefore, it is very important that we keep the grounds clean and equipment in good working order.

KINDERGARTEN SCREENING FOR SOUTHWICK-TOLLAND-GRANVILLE CHILDREN

The Southwick-Tolland-Granville Regional School District Kindergarten Screening for the 2016-2017 school year will be held from <u>Wednesday, May</u> <u>11th through Thursday, May 12th, 2016 at</u> <u>Woodland School for Southwick, Tolland and</u> <u>Granville residents.</u>

In order to be eligible for Kindergarten, a child must be *five* years old on or before September 1, 2016. There will be no exceptions to this policy. As required by Special Education Law, Chapter 766, screenings will be conducted in the areas of hearing, vision, speech/language, cognitive and motor skills. **All parents having an eligible** child should come to the Woodland School office at 80 Powder Mill Road, Southwick, MA to pick up an enrollment packet between now and May 11th. Open enrollment hours are 9:15 am to 2:45 pm. Granville residents should pick up an enrollment packet at Granville School and return it to Granville School.

A check off list is included in the packet for your convenience. Once you've filled out your paperwork and have the necessary documents (proof of residency, birth certificate, immunization record and physical) as noted on the check off list, **return ALL information to the Woodland School Office**. An appointment will be made for you at that time to attend the screening (May 11th or May 12th) to complete the registration process.
