Dog Licenses

Many folks have either stopped into town hall or via mail requested to license their dog(s) for 2017. There are still many on record who have not, so this is a friendly reminder to do so before May 1; otherwise, there will be a late fee of \$20/dog. For the safety of all dogs in town we maintain a list of all licensed dogs as well as dogs on record that veterinarians have advised us have their rabies vaccination, but may not licensed. The census package included a dog license application for dog owners on record to license their dog. For first time licensing of your dog(s), you may go to the Town web site and print a form to complete. You may also call, request a form via mail, email or stop by the Town Hall. All dogs that are six months of age or older must be licensed annually under M.G.L. Ch. 140. An updated proof of rabies vaccination is required prior to licensing as well as proof of spaying and neutering. Incomplete applications will be returned to the sender.

Marriage Intentions

If you wish to marry, you may contact my office or any other Town Clerk in the Commonwealth. The first document that a couple must complete is the Marriage Intentions Form and both must

be present at the same time to do so. Following this, a license is issued and you can be married any place in the Commonwealth. Your marriage license is filed at the Town Clerk's Office where the Marriage Intentions Form is completed. Vital Records

Birth records are filed based on residence. If you are a resident of Granville at the time of the birth of your child, then the child's birth certificate will be filed in Granville. Death records are filed in the community in which you pass away. Certified copies of vital records (Birth, Marriage, Death) are \$10.00.





NEW BRICK SCHOOL-HOUSE NOW BEING BUILT AT THE CORNERS WILL PROBABLY BE READY BY OCTOBER 10

Granville's new schoolhouse, now being built to replace the old one at the Corners, will according to the contract be ready for use by October 10. It is to be a one-story colonial brick structure with slate roof. Two wings will each contain two schoolrooms of 35 capacity apiece, with the seats so arranged as to let the light fall over the pupil's left shoulders. The central section contains toilet rooms, a kitchen and an office in the front, and in the rear a combination gymnasium and auditorium fitted with removable bleachers. Space is provided in the upper part of the center section for the installation of showers and locker rooms.

The building will be heated by steam from a furnace located under one of the wings. In the same place will be electric pumps and a pressure tank for the water supply. An artesian well has already been driven to a depth of 218 feet. It will supply ice-cold water at the rate of 7 gallons a minute. A Univent system will provide ventilation.

The cost of the new school is about 30,800 dollars, 17,500 of which was borrowed, and 13,300 was held on hand in funds. It is on the Pendleton lot on the main road at the Corners. This lot is 10 acres and was bought from a separate fund.

Mr. Ralph R. Roberts is the head of the committee in charge of the building. Haynes and Mason of Fitchburg are the architects, F. W. Waterman and Co. of Athol are the contractors.

The school, which had its graduation services on June 21, has the eight grammar school grades. Miss Verill has been teaching grades 1-3. Mrs. Gooding grades 4-6, and Miss Kearns grades 7-8.

Recipe of the month:

Frosted Zucchini Brownies

½ cup vegetable oil

11/2 cups white sugar

2 tsp vanilla extract

1 egg

MAY 2017

2 cups all-purpose flour

½ cup unsweetened cocoa powder

2 tsp baking soda

2 ½ cups grated zucchini, undrained

Frosting:

1/3 cup milk

1/3 cup butter

1½ cups white sugar

1 cup chocolate chips

Preheat oven to 350 degrees, grease and flour a 9x13 pan. Combine oil, sugar, egg and vanilla. In a separate bowl, combine flour, cocoa powder and baking soda. Add flour mixture to the sugar mixture and stir well. (It will appear quite dry) Gently stir in the zucchini and spread the mixture into your prepared pan. Bake 25 to 30 minutes.

Frosting

While cake is cooling, combine butter, milk and sugar in a small pan. Bring to a boil over medium heat. Allow to boil vigorously for 30 seconds. Remove from heat and stir in chocolate chips. Immediately pour over warm brownies. Let cool completely before cutting.
