The Southwick Building Project is well underway and the newly renovated Middle-High School (for grades 7-12) is nearing completion. Southwick (Powder Mill) 7th and 8th graders are scheduled to move into this new building in January of 2015. The School Committee has proposed relocating Granville's 7th and 8th graders in September of 2015, but a group of Granville parents has requested that this decision be delayed at least one year. The School Committee is considering this request and will likely make its decision during one of their upcoming November meetings. Apply now for 2015 project funding!!

The Community Preservation Comm. has significant funding available for qualified projects in 3 categories:

Historic Preservation

Open Space & Recreation

Community Housing

The Community Preservation Committee (CPC) will begin meeting in November to provide information and to accept and consider applications for project funding in 2015. The CPC will meet on the following dates at 7 pm at the Granville Town Hall.

Nov. 20, 2014

Dec. 18, 2014

Jan. 15, 2015

Feb. 19, 2015

March 19, 2015

April 16, 2015

(if necessary)

The application deadline is January 31, 2015.Applications will be accepted from now until the deadline.

Those interested in applying for grant money should plan to meet with the committee at one of our regularly scheduled meetings to discuss details of your proposal. Our meetings are open to all to assist with clarifying qualifying criteria for CPA grants.

Legislative changes to the Community
Preservation Act (CPA) in 2012 now allow for
rehabilitation and restoration of open space,
recreational land, historic resources and
community housing even if the property was not
originally acquired or created using CPA funds.
This is a more lenient standard than in the past,
which required that the rehab be done only on
land purchased with CPA grant money. This
allows the CPC to consider funding of a wider
range of projects. The same legislative action also
will increase matching funds from the State for
local CPA projects.

Butter Nut Squash with apples and cranberries

1/4 cup butter

1 medium butternut squash, peeled and cut into ½ inch cubes (about 5 cups)

1 medium apple cubed

1/2 cup dried cranberries

1/4 tsp ground cinnamon

14 tsp ground nutmeg

2 tbsp. firmly packed brown sugar

Preheat oven to 425

In a 1 ½ quart baking dish, combine all ingredients, season if desire with salt. Cover and bake for 30 minutes Remove cover and bake for 15 minutes or until squash is tender.

WINTER IS COMING....

You will need to take steps for your protection, to ensure your safety you will need to understand the following winter terms:

Winter Storm Watch – be alert a storm is likely

Winter Storm Warning – Take action the storm is in or entering your area.

Blizzard Warning – Snow and strong winds combined will produce blinding snow, near zero visibility, deep drifts and life threatening wind chill seek shelter immediately

Winter Weather Advisory – Winter weather conditions are expected to cause significant inconveniences and may be hazardous to be on the roads

Frost/Freeze Warning – Below freezing temperatures are expected and may cause damage to plants, crops and fruit trees.

Winter Emergency Supply Kit – Stock enough supplies to survive three to five days including: prescriptions, nonperishable canned goods, dried fruit and nuts, manual can opener, water (1 gallon per person per day) extra batteries, portable radio, baby care, pet supplies, extra blankets, sleeping bag and a fire extinguisher.


