Business Certificate:

What is a Business Certificate?

Commonly known as a "DBA" ("doing business as"), a Business Certificate creates a public record of the name and address of the owner(s) of a business. This also includes anyone operating any type of home-based business. Consumers are entitled to this information and it may not otherwise be readily available.

Who must file a Business Certificate?

Massachusetts General Law Chapter 110, § 5 states that any person conducting business in the Commonwealth under any title other than the real name of the person conducting the business, whether individually or as a partnership, shall file a Business Certificate in the office of the Town Clerk of every city or town where an office of any such person or partnership may be situated.

Under Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 110, §6 a Business Certificate is not required if a corporation is doing business under any title which includes the true surname of any partner. Certain other associations and partnerships may also be exempt (refer to above citation for details.)

How do I file or renew a Business Certificate?

Forms are available by mail, on the town website or in person at the Town Clerk's Office, 707 Main Road or by calling 413-357-8585, Ext 3. Each person named on the Business Certificate must either sign the form in person at the Town Clerk's Office or have their signature notarized on the form by a Notary Public. Filing a DBA does not protect your business name. The filing fee is \$30.00 and good for four years. Proper identification will be required.

Does the filing of a Business Certificate protect me from others using the same name?

No. The protection of a trademark (word, name, symbol or device) in Massachusetts is accomplished through the Secretary of State's Office.

What if I discontinue or withdraw from the business or move to another location?

A Statement of Discontinuance, Change of Residence form must be completed and filed with the Town Clerk if one of the following occurs before the expiration (discontinuance or information change filing fee is \$10.00):

- Business is discontinued,
- One or more persons named on the certificate is withdrawn or retired from the business or partnership,
- Change of residence of one of the named persons on the certificate, or

• One or more of the persons named on the certificate dies.

Vital Records:

Birth records are filed based on residence. If you are a resident of Granville at the time of the birth of your child, then the child's birth certificate will be filed in Granville. Death records are filed in the community in which you pass away. Certified copies of vital records (Birth, Marriage, Death) are \$10.00.

Notary Public:

The Town Clerk, as well as the Town Administrator/Matt Streeter are Notaries Public. If you need our services, please call either of us and make an appointment. The service is free of charge to Granville residents.

The Granville Fire Department wants to keep you safe this heating season!

Be aware of Carbon Monoxide (CO) dangers! CO

is of particular concern during cold weather when doors and windows are closed, and heating appliances such as wood stoves and furnaces are in full operation. Here are some simple tips to keep you and your family safe:

- You cannot see or smell Carbon Monoxide. Working CO detectors are the <u>only way</u> to detect it in your home.
- CO can come from furnaces, heaters, water heaters, generators, cars, and grills.
- You should have working CO alarms outside every sleeping area, and on every level of your home.
- CO alarms should be tested monthly. If it is a plug in type detector make sure it has a battery backup.
- If your CO alarm sounds, get outside to fresh air immediately and call 911. GFD will meter your home to ensure the air is safe.
- Operate portable generators outside, check your furnace and fireplace for proper exhaust ventilation. Loose or broken pipes should be fixed immediately.

Heating Fire Facts - Heating caused nearly 10,000 fires in Massachusetts over the last five years. Heating is the second leading cause of home fires in the state.

- Chimneys and Furnaces Have furnaces and chimneys checked by a professional every year before the start of the heating season. Fuel assistance programs can help homeowners with maintenance and repair costs.
- Wood, Pellet and Coal Stoves These solid fuel stoves require a permit from the local building inspector to ensure they are installed safely and properly. Dispose of ashes in a metal container, with a lid, away from the house, garage, and porch.
- Space Heaters Need Space Keep anything that can burn at least three feet away from space heaters.
- Glass Front Fireplaces: Prevent Contact Burns - Glass front fireplaces are a cause of contact burns for young children. A new ANSI Z21.50 Standard for Vented Gas Fireplaces requires installation of protective barriers on all new installations.
- Unvented Kerosene Heaters Illegal in Massachusetts - Dangerous unvented kerosene heaters are illegal in Massachusetts, but they are still available in other states. They pose both fire and carbon monoxide risks.

Together, we can improve the life safety and well -being of our Granville residents!



Pumpkin Crunch Cake

1 (15 oz) can pumpkin puree

1 (12 oz) can evaporated milk

1 tbsp. pumpkin pie spice
1 tsp. salt
1 box yellow cake mix
1 cup chopped pecans
1 cup unsalted butter, melted

2 tsp. pure vanilla extract

¹/₂ cup packed light brown sugar

Directions:

4 large eggs ½ cup sugar

Preheat oven to 350, butter a 9x13 inch baking pan (total baking time 1 hour)

In a large bowl, whisk the pumpkin, milk, eggs, sugars, vanilla, pumpkin pie spice and salt until well combined and smooth.

Pour mixture into prepared pan and spread into an even layer; sprinkle dry cake mix evenly over the pumpkin mixture and use your hands to gently press it into the batter. Sprinkle the top of the cake with chopped pecans and evenly drizzle the melted butter over the entire cake.

Bake in the preheated oven for 40 minutes. At this point, check your cake, if the top is becoming to brown, cover the cake with a piece of foil and continue to bake for 10 to 20 minutes or until set.

Remove pan to a wire rack to cool completely. Chill for a few hours before serving. If desired, top with whipped cream and chopped pecans before serving.

Restoring the American Chestnut Tree to the Eastern Forest of the U.S.

Presented by John Meiklejohn. For centuries the American Chestnut was a majestic and useful giant of the eastern U.S. forest. It's bountiful annual harvest of nuts served man and wildlife alike, and the rot-resistant nature of its wood made it a valuable resource in many industries. However, in the early 20th century, an invasive Chestnut Blight from Asia decimated the American Chestnut population. For the past 35 years, The American Chestnut Foundation [TACF] has persevered with increasingly sophisticated research and progress towards restoring the American Chestnut. John will speak about the Foundation's ongoing restoration efforts up and down the East Coast, including the research orchards right here in Granville.
