

# WINTER ROADS POLICY 2018-2019 In effect from November 1 - to April 30

- On-street parking is prohibited. Vehicles will be towed at the owner's expense.
- Parking at the Town Hall, Library, or school is restricted to those doing Town business during business hours.
- During winter road operations, main roads are a priority. Therefore, Route 57, Route 189, and Old Westfield Road will be cleared first.
- Town Roads with low use may be closed for the winter.
- Depositing snow on a Town road is prohibited.
- Plowing snow across a Town road is prohibited.
- "All season" tires are not a substitute for snow tires.
- High quality snow tires are essential.
- Limit travel during storm events.
- Drive below the posted speed.
- Be aware of changing road conditions, flurries, and frost. Shaded areas become hazardous rapidly. An isolated weather event will create hazardous conditions. Notorious for this are the Gorge and Hairpin Turn on Route 57, the North end of Old Westfield Road, and Water Street by the Transfer Station.

### **Winter Storm Policy**

### Mailbox Damage During Winter Storms and Snow Removal Operations

Responsibility for Fixing/Replacing Roadside Mailboxes

This policy applies to all Granville residents.

Mailboxes damaged by *snow* discharged from a snow plow will be the responsibility of the homeowner.

Mailboxes damaged by contact with the *plow* will be repaired by the Highway Department.

The Highway Department will make repairs to mailboxes hit by the plow as soon as possible. Many mailboxes are closer to the pavement edge than recommended. Mailboxes that are in poor condition cannot with-stand heavy snow coming off a plow.

Mailboxes hit by an operator will repaired and the resident will receive an apology for the inconvenience.

### The Granville Fire Department wants to keep you safe this heating season!

### Be aware of Carbon Monoxide (CO) dangers!

CO is of particular concern during cold weather when doors and windows are closed, and heating appliances such as wood stoves and furnaces are in full operation. Here are some simple tips to keep you and your family safe:

- You cannot see or smell Carbon Monoxide.
   Working CO detectors are the <u>only way</u> to detect it in your home.
- CO can come from furnaces, heaters, water heaters, generators, cars, and grills.
- You should have working CO alarms outside every sleeping area, and on every level of your home.
- CO alarms should be tested monthly. If it is a plug in type detector make sure it has a battery backup.
- If your CO alarm sounds, get outside to fresh air immediately and call 911. GFD will meter your home to ensure the air is safe.
- Operate portable generators outside, check your furnace and fireplace for proper exhaust ventilation. Loose or broken pipes should be fixed immediately.

### **Heating Fire Facts -**

Heating caused nearly 10,000 fires in Massachusetts over the last five years. Heating is the second leading cause of home fires in the state.

- Chimneys and Furnaces Have furnaces and chimneys checked by a professional every year before the start of the heating season. Fuel assistance programs can help homeowners with maintenance and repair costs.
- Wood, Pellet and Coal Stoves These solid fuel stoves require a permit from the local building inspector to ensure they are installed safely and properly. Dispose of ashes in a metal container, with a lid, away from the house, garage, and porch.
- Space Heaters Need Space Keep anything that can burn at least three feet away from space heaters.
- Glass Front Fireplaces: Prevent Contact Burns Glass front fireplaces are a cause of contact
  burns for young children. A new ANSI Z21.50
  Standard for Vented Gas Fireplaces requires
  installation of protective barriers on all new
  installations.
- Unvented Kerosene Heaters Illegal in Massachusetts - Dangerous unvented kerosene heaters are illegal in Massachusetts, but they are still available in other states. They pose both fire and carbon monoxide risks.

Together, we can improve the life safety and well-being of our Granville residents!


