## Dear Granville Residents,

The Granville Federated Church welcomes everyone who chooses to worship and share fellowship. We welcome diversity and encourage free-thinking. We recognize that the path to spirituality is varied. You are invited to join us for weekly services on Sunday mornings and/or our monthly potluck dinners and breakfasts.

The Granville Federated Church is struggling financially. We desperately need your help. Our expenses for 2015 have exceeded our revenues by $\$ 12,000$. Many long-term members have passed away in recent years, reducing our base of support. The Church's budget is already "bare-boned."

We sincerely believe that the survival of our church is truly important to our members and friends and all Granville residents. We are the heart of the town with weddings, memorial services, family reunions, Lions Club events, AA meetings, concerts and many other activities that benefit both members and friends of the church and Granville's residents. The Church sponsors the Town's annual $4^{\text {th }}$ of July chicken barbecue and Memorial Day ceremonies. Our members play an active role in the Town's emergency medical services. We are adding a generator from capital campaign funds so that our Church can provide a "warming center" in another prolonged power failure. We need to be able to keep our doors open.

We have attempted to reduce the short-fall with various fund-raisers such as church suppers, breakfasts, Harvest Fair and sales of Big Y cards, but these do not raise nearly enough to bridge the gap.

On a brighter note, the new roof, heating system and windows are reducing our energy costs.
Unfortunately, we believe that the enormous success of the capital campaign redirected funds away from annual giving which contributed to our budget shortfall.

## Granville CULTURAL COUNCIL SEEKS FUNDING PROPOSALS

Proposals for community-oriented arts, humanities, and science programs due October 15

The Granville Cultural Council has set an October 15th postmark deadline for organizations, schools and individuals to apply for grants that support cultural activities in the community.

According to Council spokesperson, these grants can support a variety of artistic projects and activities in Granville including exhibits, festivals, field trips, short-term artist residencies or performances in schools, workshops and lectures.

The Granville Cultural Council is part of a network of 329 Local Cultural Councils serving all 351 cities and towns in the Commonwealth. The LCC Program is the largest grassroots cultural funding network in the nation, supporting thousands of community-based projects in the arts, sciences and humanities every year. The state legislature provides an annual appropriation to the Massachusetts Cultural Council, a state agency, which then allocates funds to each community.

This year, the Granville Cultural Council will distribute about $\$ 4400.00$ in grants. Previously funded projects include: Watercolor Summer Workshop, Summer Reading Program, Christmas with Nova Cantori and NCCHP Living History.

Jutius David Marks was a West Granville son. $\mathcal{H}$ is father was Samuel S. Marks, owner of the Tavern Stand in the Village Center in 1850, and Grother to Lyman B. Marks, who once lived with his family in the Dave Day place.

Jufius acquired land in West Granville in 1860 with a house and a Glacksmith shop. He married Emma Witson of Blandford. They had three children. None lived very long.
Julius also died young around 1890. His widow lived until 1920. In time, she had an impressive, handsome obelisk monument placed as a tribute to her husband. This is in the very old section of the West Granville Cemetery.

Mrs. Marks gave $\$ 25.00$ to be invested in the Cemetery Fund with the interest to be used to put a plant on his burial site each year. For many, many years, under the able care of Gilbert Miller, Joe Duris, Hank Miller and Con Clendenin there was always a flower growing up on the fill.

The glorious colors of fall foliage in New England and the aromas of the season make Columbus Day weekend a perfect time to visit Granville and experience our annual Harvest Fair.

Coming through the Granville Gorge from Southwick on Rt. 57 you arrive at the Village School. Park your car there, spend some time in the school shopping at the Craft vendors and sample tasty foods. Outside, a Shuttle Bus awaits you for the short ride to the Library where there is a Giant Book Sale; vendors galore fill the lawn. Next door is the Federated Church with more crafters, food and a quiet sanctuary for rest.

Across the road is the Town Green with an abundance of things to see, do and buy. There are activities for kids, food to enjoy and vendors to visit.

Beyond the church and a short walk or bus trip up Water Street is the Noble \& Cooley Drum Shop. This 1854 factory is still making drums for today's musicians. It houses the Noble \& Cooley Center for Historic Preservation, a museum of industrial history, which you may visit. There will be a blacksmith shop, a beer garden, crafts and other things to see and buy.

Returning to the Shuttle Bus, you will treat yourself to a ride up the hill to the 1802 Meeting House. On the lawn are the Annual Scarecrow Convention and a display of Vintage Tractors. Inside this historic building is the beautiful display of quilts made by members of the Granville Quilt \& Needlework Guild. Handmade/homemade items are there for you to purchase from the various crafters. You will be able to relax at tables, eat a slice of hot Apple Pie with cheese and enjoy a cup of homemade soup.

You may choose to leave your car at the Town Hall where additional parking is available, ride one of the yellow shuttle busses, and partake of the fair's adventures in the other direction. The Town Hall lot is just up the road from the Old Meeting House.
