October 19th -

Last day to register to vote and to change party enrollment for the General Election (in towns with fewer than 1500 voters i.e. Granville, registration sessions will be held 2:00 pm to 4:00 pm)

November 7th -Absentee Ballot request deadline 12 PM

November 8th – Absentee Ballot return deadline 8 PM

Vital Records

Birth records are filed based on residence. If you are a resident of Granville at the time of the birth of your child, then the child's birth certificate will be filed in Granville. Death records are filed in the community in which you pass away. Certified copies of vital records (Birth, Marriage, Death) are \$10.00.

Marriage Intentions

If you wish to marry, you can contact my office (357.8585 Ext 3) or any other Town Clerk in the Commonwealth. The first document that the couple must complete is the Marriage Intentions Form and both must be present at the same time to do so. Following this, a license is issued and you can be married any place in the Commonwealth. Your marriage license is filed at the Town Clerk's Office where the Marriage Intentions Form is completed. Cinnamon Roasted Butternut squash

1 large butternut squash, peeled/seeded and cut into 1 inch cubes

3 tbsp. olive oil

2 tbsp. packed brown sugar

1 tsp ground cinnamon

1 tsp kosher salt

1 tsp freshly ground black pepper

Pre heat oven to 425 with rack on upper middle position. Line baking sheet with heavy duty foil. In a large bowl toss the squash with remaining ingredients until thoroughly coated. Transfer to foil lined baking sheet in a single layer without overcrowding pieces. Roast about 40 minutes, rotating pan midway during baking. When edges are browned and cubes are fork-tender, remove from oven immediately. You may want to start checking squash around 35 minutes just to ensure that they don't become overcooked.





Museum Events October 2016.




We would like to welcome everyone back to school and hope you all had a wonderful summer!


