FREE FLYFISHING CLINIC SEPT. 13

WESTFIELD, Mass. (August 25, 2014) – The Westfield River Watershed Association (WRWA) and the Western Mass. Fly Fishermen will offer a free Introduction to Fly Fishing clinic Saturday, September 13 from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The clinic will take place on Route 20 in Huntington, Mass., in the turnout on the Westfield River, across from the Huntington Health Clinic.

People can drop in throughout the day and watch a fly tying demonstration, as well as practice casting. If they own a fly rod and want to learn more about using it, WRWA encourages them to bring it to the clinic. In addition, a biologist will be on hand to net insects from the river and help participants learn to identify them under microscopes.

There will be a portable toilet on site. The clinic will be held rain or shine, barring extremely stormy weather.

The Westfield River Watershed Association was established in 1953 to protect and improve the natural resources of the watershed, as well as to expand recreational and other land use opportunities for people's enjoyment and for sound ecology. To learn more, visit www.westfieldriver.org.



Here's what's happening at the NCCHP museum at the drum factory in September. Mark your calendars and visit soon!

The Danes are here! The newest rotating exhibit features the Danish colony that settled in Granville in the late 1800's. Come learn about Denmark and how, when, where and why so many Danes settled in Granville. Many old artifacts are on display including shipping trunks, wooden shoes, and household items as well as pictures and information about the early Danish families. Lots to see and explore about the daily lives and contributions of these families to Granville and the surrounding towns.

On Tuesday, 9/10 at 7:00 PM, the free monthly Living History series features Sylvia G. Buck and her program "The Life and Times of Lucy Stone". Join us for an entertaining and informative evening as Mrs. Buck, director of the Warren Public Library and chairperson of the Warren Historical Commission, describes the many accomplishments of Lucy Stone – American reformer, suffragist and pioneer in the women's movement to name a few. Light refreshments served after the program.

Sunday, 9/21 from 10 AM – 4 PM, the 10th Massachusetts Volunteer Infantry will set up a Living History Day camp around the pond at the museum. The mission of the 10th Mass is to participate in events to honor the memory and traditions of a past military regiment which played an important part in the protection of the western part of the state of Massachusetts and preservation of the Union. Come meet and talk with members of the 10th Mass regiment about their daily life in camp and preparing for battle during the Civil War. This free living history event will be fun for the whole family!


