Do you wonder, 'What can I do to make a difference?' If so, this free 3-part series on climate change will offer you factual information from two climate experts, identify practical ways to tackle the challenges ahead, and invite conversation that brings an American 'can do' spirit to dealing with a hotter world.

Part I: Climate Change 101: What You Need to Know

Monday, Sept. 26th, 7 PM via Zoom

Presenter: Carsten Braun, PhD, Professor of Geography, Planning & Sustainability Department, Westfield State University, Westfield, MA

Climate change does not have to be complicated or intimidating. In this presentation we will review the science of climate change, discuss its impacts and explore the practical solutions that are available right here, right now. Suitable for adults and older teens.

Part II: What Will Drive Our Climate Future?

Monday, Oct. 3rd, 7 PM via Zoom

Presenter: Gary Yohe, PhD, Huffington Foundation Professor of Economics & Environmental Studies at Wesleyan University; Senior Member, U.N. Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change [IPCC]

This session will explore the limitations of what we know and don't know about climate change and how we can still make proactive decisions to "abate" or "adapt". Ample time will be available for discussion and Q & A.

Part III: Taking Action: Exploring Ways to Tackle the Climate Crisis

Monday, Oct. 17th, 7 PM via Zoom

Facilitated by: Voices for Climate [V4C], a committee of Voices Rising Together [VRT], a Granville-based community group

Drawing on our American 'can do' spirit, this final session will explore a range of constructive steps each of us can take, both as individuals and in groups, to turn a looming crisis into a triumph.

Local Libraries Unite for Climate

HAMPDEN and HAMPSHIRE COUNTIES – Area residents hoping to learn ways to save money, live sustainably, and plan for a hotter future need look no further than nine Western Massachusetts libraries.

Saturday, Sept. 24 through Friday, September 30, the Pioneer Valley Library Collaborative (PVLC) will present Climate Preparedness Week, a national event spearheaded annually by the Boston-based nonprofit, Communities Responding to Extreme Weather.

"Climate change is a topic that's on a lot of people's minds, and libraries are the purveyors of information in our communities. Climate Preparedness Week allows us to join together to offer factual information through engaging programs," Lynn Blair, Southwick Public Library director and PVLC's lead librarian, said.

"The nice thing about the PVLC is that we can find local presenters with local information that can answer local people's questions," Blair said.

Free and open to residents of any town, Climate Preparedness Week offers a broad slate of events for patrons of all ages. Programs include a chance to practice mindfulness in beautiful Stanley Park with a Kripalu-trained instructor; a kids' cooking class using locally grown produce, and an opportunity to engage in "Climate Change 101" with Westfield State University professor, Dr. Carsten Braun.

Other Climate Preparedness Week events include an adult nature-writing workshop, a renewable energy experiment where kids roast marshmallows in a solar oven, take-and-make crafts, and advice from an Audubon conservation scientist guiding local landowners in managing forests for climate resilience.

"Climate Preparedness Week is this opportunity for us, at every age, to be able to understand our world today. We're so disconnected from nature that we don't really understand it - and it's changing so quickly it's actually hard to grasp it. Libraries are a place to begin to understand what to do both for ourselves and our planet," Lise LeTellier, Granville Public Library director, said.

"No matter what age we're at, the library provides us with good information," she said.

The Pioneer Valley Library Collaborative is a partnership of Western Massachusetts libraries united to share, at no cost, its combined ideas, materials, and resources in order to more broadly educate, inspire, and assist surrounding communities. Participating libraries include Agawam Public Library, Easthampton's Emily Williston Memorial Library, Northampton's Forbes Library, Granville Public Library, Southwick Public Library, Tolland Public Library, West Springfield Public Library, Westhampton Public Library, the Westfield Athenaeum, and the Granville grassroots citizens group, Voices for Climate.

"Climate change is happening," LeTellier said. "Every year is so different, and we don't know what to expect any more. Learning to be prepared for the unexpected is more important now than ever."



TOWN OF GRANVILLE PUBLIC AUCTION September 21, 2022

On September 21, 2022 at 12:00PM at Granville Town Hall, 707 Main Road, Granville, MA, there will be a public auction of seven Town owned properties. Most were taken through the Tax Title process while the West Granville School will be auctioned by virtue of an Annual Town Meeting Vote (Article 22, May 15, 2015).

Properties include buildable parcels which have passed perc tests on North Lane (two parcels), Crest Lane, Barnard Road, South Lane and the West Granville School on Beech Hill Road. One non-buildable property on Beech Hill Road is also on the auction block.





Outside of Granville Fire Amanda works full time as a Case Specialist for the Juvenile Court in Springfield and is also Teaching Assistant at EMT Academy in Chicopee. Amanda also enjoys going to the gym, reading, and going on adventures to all types of places. 


