



COMMUNITY NEWS & RESOURCES

At the Community Senior meeting on July 19, 2023, fifteen people enjoyed lunch and gathered information from Highland Valley Elder Services on topics including but not limited to Care Advisors, money management, the SHINE program for insurance questions, coordination of Home Care and respite services. Costs are based on a state income sliding scale basis. The <u>first step</u> to learn how to access these services and/ or obtain an appointment with a Care Advisor is to call the Highland Valley program at 413-586-2000.

At the first Community Senior meeting in June 2023, three areas were identified by the people in attendance as the more important issues (see July Country Caller). The areas were establishment of a "buddy system", "food accessibility" and "transportation." "Buddy programs"

In response, Bobbi O'Connell and Terry Hodur began an exploration of "buddy programs" provided in the area. Thanks to Lise LeTellier, our Granville Librarian, we had a list of "buddy programs" which we learned are officially called Neighbor-to Neighbor Programs. We met with the Directors of two of these programs and the outreach coordinator in Tolland to hear what we could learn.

Diane Porcella, Director of the Northampton Neighbor-to-Neighbor Program, told us of a nationwide system of Neighbor-to-Neighbor programs coordinated by the Village Network Association (vtvnetworking.org). There are 300 programs throughout the country. This network provides a computer platform and is a resource for programs. Northampton has 501C3 status which enables the program to solicit tax free donations. Area employers and private donors sponsor their program and supply funds. With only two part time paid employees, this program relies on volunteers for phone calls, visiting, and driving. Before asking for a service, a Northampton citizen needs to become a member, meaning basic information is completed. There is no cost for membership.

Bobbi and Terry then met with Jodi Ross, the Administrator of the Easthampton Neighbor-to-Neighbor and the Director of Volunteers, Sharon Tilbi. They also have corporate sponsors, and private donors.. Membership is free, but basic information needs to be obtained through an application. When a member requests a service, Jodi lists this request on the website, and a volunteer willing to do this service will contact her. She will then make a phone call linking the member and the volunteer.

Tolland's Outreach Worker Mary Ann Demming brings the Seniors together with phone calls and invitations to their weekly coffee hour and monthly luncheons. She is available to answer questions, make wellness calls, and works with the goal of building relationships among the Seniors. Mary Ann works closely with the Council of Aging President Ruth Buchanan.

"Food Accessibility" issue found us meeting with Director of the Southwick Community Food Pantry, Sally Munson. She encouraged Bobbi and Terry to further explore building a link to get food from the Food Pantry to Granville residents. The pantry has a lot to offer in the way of food supplies. A basic bag is 30 to 40 lbs. of food per person. At times when supplies allow, people can choose the food they want. There is a simple one-time membership application to be completed to access weekly services. We talked about several options, and look forward to exploring these to see what can be organized to help us here in Granville.

"Transportation" was a big issue with all the people and communities we met with. Discussions were held regarding collaboration between bordering towns including Southwick, Granville and Tolland.

We greatly appreciated these visits and are grateful to the folks who cheerfully opened their doors to us and our community. Any thoughts and/or suggestions on the above information are welcome. On to the next step, to see what solutions we can develop for Granville!!

Commonwealth Of Massachusetts

Massachusetts General Laws

Chapter 266 Section 105: Stone walls or fences; unauthorized removal

Section 105. Whoever willfully and without right pulls down or removes any portion of a stone wall or fence which is erected or maintained for the purpose of enclosing land shall be punished by a fine of not more than ten dollars. Natural resource officers and deputy natural resource officers of the office of the secretary of the executive office of environmental affairs, may arrest without a warrant any person found violating this section.

Robert (Bob) D. Alden

Bob, age 94, passed away on August 4, 2023. Born in Springfield, MA on August 4, 1929, he was the son of Russell and Ethel (Twining) Alden.

As a young boy, Bob helped his father raise chickens at their home in Springfield, where he also met his best friend of 82 years, Donald Barth. Bob, his parents and three sisters spent many cherished days at their family camp in Plainfield, MA. He would spend afternoons playing in the neighboring brook, fishing for trout and picking blueberries for his father to sell.

Bob attended Springfield Technical High School, and later went on to attend Norwich University in Northfield, VT from 1946-1950. Although Bob was dedicated to learning to become a mechanical engineer, he still found plenty of time to play pranks on his fellow classmates and professors. Following University, Bob served two years of active duty in the Army from 1951-1953.

Bob met his soulmate, Marianne Neef, in Springfield, who he married in 1956. The two of them settled in Granville, where they established their home and built their family together. Bob and Marianne enjoyed hosting their friends for dinner parties and traveling the country in their RV.

Bob was known for his smart wit and was a true engineer who could fix anything you put in front of him. He always had a fascination for anything with an engine, particularly airplanes and automobiles. He worked as a Test Engineer at Kaman Aircraft and had a hobby of flying remote control planes. One of his proudest achievements was helping to build "Miss Claire," a Van's RV-8 Aircraft, which is still flying today. Bob owned Humphrey's Garage in Granville for 29 years. When it was time to retire, he sold his business to Doug Jordan, the son he never had, who still runs the Garage carrying on Bob's local legacy.

If Bob wasn't outside enjoying an evening cocktail with Marianne or relaxing in his recliner with his cat Brody, he most likely could be found tinkering in his workshop, repairing electronics or turning bowls and trivets on his grandfather's wood lathe. Over his 94 years of life, Bob developed many lifelong friendships from his childhood, college days, travels, life in Granville and time spent at the Springfield Turnverein Club, where he helped maintain the property and assisted with events.

He was predeceased by his loving wife Marianne of 64 years, along with his three sisters Doris, Priscilla and Jean. To cherish his memory, Bob leaves his daughters Susan Petersen and her husband Karl, Karen Peebles and her husband Rick and Barbara Marcotte and her husband Michael; his grandchildren Melissa, Joseph, Kyle, Jameson and Nicole; and his great grandchildren Sarah, Lukas, Savannah, Ethan and Zoe.
