In Massachusetts, the deadline to request a ballot <u>by mail</u> must be received no later than 5 pm on Wednesday, November 2nd.

<u>In person</u> voting for the State Election will take place at the Town Hall during the following days and hours:

Marriage Intentions

If you wish to marry, you can contact my office or any other Town Clerk in the Commonwealth. The first document that the couple must complete is the Marriage Intentions Form and both must be present at the same time to do so. Following this, a license is issued and you can be married any place in the Commonwealth. Your marriage license is filed at the Town Clerk's Office where Marriage Intentions Form is completed. Vital Records

Birth records are filed based on residence. If you are a resident of Granville at the time of the birth of your child, then the child's birth certificate will be filed in Granville. 

The redistricting proposal moves one Agawam precinct into the West Springfield-based 6th Hampden District, though Agawam would remain the largest population center in the proposed 3rd Hampden District.]



Wednesday, October 5th @ 6:30 "Robert Frost in Story and Song"


Don't miss this exciting presentation of poetry and music at the NCCHP museum on Wednesday, October 5th at 6:30 PM at 42 Water St. in Granville. Walt Woodward, the CT State Historian emeritus and former Associate Professor of History at UCONN, shares stories about the poet's life and work, including a number of his poems. "The Band of Steady Habits" will perform songs from the 20th and 21st centuries that reflect the moods of the poems.

Prof. Woodward is a scholar of Early American history, with an emphasis on Connecticut and New England. His research interests cover a variety of subjects, including the history of science, and the use of music in Early America.

The NCCHP Living History programs at the museum are free for members and free will donations of \$5-10 from other attendees are appreciated. 




