Dog Licenses

If you have a dog(s) and I missed sending you a form, call or stop in. All dogs that are six months of age or older must be licensed annually under M.G.L. Ch. 140. An updated proof of rabies vaccination is required prior to licensing as well as proof of spaying and neutering. Fee for a spayed or neutered dog is \$10. Fee for an unaltered dog is \$15. It is the owner's responsibility to register their pets by April 15th. A late fee of \$20 will be charged after May 1st.

Marriage Intentions

If you wish to marry, you can contact my office (357.8585 Ext 3) or any other Town Clerk in the Commonwealth. The first document that the couple must complete is the Marriage Intentions Form and both must be present at the same time to do so. Following this, a license is issued and you can be married any place in the Commonwealth. Your marriage license is filed at the Town Clerk's Office where the Marriage Intentions Form is completed.

Vital Records

Birth records are filed based on residence. If you are a resident of Granville at the time of the birth of your child, then the child's birth certificate will be filed in Granville. Death records are filed in the community in which you died. Certified copies of vital records (Birth, Marriage, Death) are \$10.00.

GRANVILLE BUDDY PROGRAM

The <u>Granville Buddy Program Pilot</u> review meeting took place Friday, March 8th. There were 5 pairs of Buddies, and each pair had one or both of the members represented. Selectperson Nicole Berndt also attended.

The experiences reported were overwhelmingly positive! With comments such as:

- " brought our friendship up to another level..."
- "...longtime friends, but prodded us to take time for us..."
- " learned about one another...a blessing ... "
- " sense of security ... "

The group easily determined that they wish to continue. Interestingly, each pair determined in their own way how and how often to contact each other. One pair decided phone calls daily at 8:00 a.m. would work and this became a helpful "check in" with each other. Another pair called in a less structured manner as their schedule permitted, another pair sent cards in addition to phone calls and getting together for lunch and walks also were shared. The group determined that they would meet again in three months for a further update, and in addition might plan a social get together for lunch.

We were happy to hear of these positive experiences, and the discussion moved to the group's desire to figure out ways to expand the Buddy Program to anyone who might be interested. We will begin our expansion in two ways: 1. Personal informal contact by a current Buddy with anyone whom they think might be interested. 2. Fliers around town and in the County Caller. One of the ideas we have been asked to make clear is that the Buddy Program does not need to be restricted to Seniors only.

UPDATE ON HEALTHY BONES & BALANCE CLASS

The Healthy Bones and Balance program is an exciting opportunity for people to attend a fitness program targeted on flexibility, gentle movement and balance. This will be a no cost weekly program with instructors who have been trained to provide specifically identified exercises to muscle groups and increase balance and coordination. Although we had hoped to be operating by now, we have had "snags" that caused some delay. We are still hoping to have a "demo" class sometime in April. The date has not been determined. Everyone who expressed an interest will be contacted. After this first class, we anticipate another slight delay, but within a month hope to have the weekly classes up and running. The sponsoring agency, RSVP (Retired Seniors Volunteer Program), asks that local volunteer instructors who are themselves 55 or older become trained and provide classes in the future. Representative Boldyga opposes bill to spend an additional \$245 million on migrant shelter crisis

Supports efforts to ensure emergency housing services are available to longtime Massachusetts residents, including veterans

BOSTON – State Representative Nick Boldyga (R-Southwick) recently opposed a spending bill that would commit an additional \$245 million in state funding to cover the ongoing costs of providing emergency housing to migrants, saying the bill does nothing but throw more taxpayer money at the problem without addressing the underlying policies that are incentivizing migrants to flood into the state.

According to Representative Boldyga, House Bill 4460 that was adopted on March 6 on a vote of 121-33, will bring total spending on the emergency housing assistance program to over \$820 million in Fiscal Year 2024 alone. "Less than 4 months after the governor and democrats in the legislature passed a \$250 million spending bill to support migrant housing, they once again are fleecing taxpayers and residents of the Commonwealth" said Representative Boldyga. "There is no end in sight to this reckless spending spree that prioritizes illegal migrants over the wellbeing of our own citizens."

Representative Boldyga expressed concerns that Massachusetts residents who are citizens and in need of services, including veterans, are being frozen out of receiving housing assistance as more migrants continue to arrive from out of state. "My office gets heartbreaking calls every week from single moms looking for shelter and are being told they have to wait" said Representative Boldyga.

There were several attempts to amend the bill that would have ensured emergency housing programs were prioritized for legal residents of the Commonwealth who have lived in the state for a minimum of 6 months. However, those amendments were all rejected by House democrats who hold a supermajority in the legislature.

"The motivation of democrats in Boston has become crystal clear. They would prefer to keep the flood gates of migrants coming into the state open, rather than provide for the wellbeing of the state's legal residents who are in need" said Representative Boldyga. "Make no mistake about it, it's their failed progressive policies that created this crisis and it's their failed policies that will continue to make it worse."

House leadership touted that the bill will impose new limitations on how long people can stay within the shelter system, allowing them to receive benefits for up to 12 months. Representative Boldyga said those "reforms" fall far short from doing anything to address the growing crisis. "What happens at the end of 12 months? Is the state really going to start evicting families from the shelter program?" asked Representative Boldyga. "Mark my words, a year from now democrats will be scrambling to lift or extend those limitations. They are creating a nightmare scenario that is going to end up costing taxpayers billions of dollars" he continued.

Representative Boldyga warned that this problem is only going to get worse. "Taxpayers are fleeing the state, revenue collections are down, and we're increasing spending on migrant housing. The math doesn't work" said. Representative Boldyga. "Serious reforms need to be made or we're going to continue to see painful cuts in funding for our schools, public safety, and other areas of critical local aid" he continued.
