Welcome back to the story of Woodlands Cemetery.

The cemetery is now waking up after a winter's rest. Soon the grass will turn green and the leaves will emerge.

The CPA application that we submitted in January has been approved by the Community Preservation Committee and will be brought before the town for review and vote at the town meeting in May. We are hopeful that it will be received positively. The town, in the past, has donated some amount to the upkeep of the cemetery and we are requesting that again this year.

A lovely handwritten book, listing all the occupants of Woodlands Cemetery as of 1981-82, has been turned over to the Historical Room in the Library. It was compiled by Helena Duris. It was used as a starting point for the updated document that we have just completed which lists all of the people, their parents, and their spouses, who are buried at Woodlands. The document is available on line on the Library's Historic Image Library website. It will be expanded this summer to contain the GPS coordinates of each grave enabling families and interested persons to find any specific one. It will be kept up to date. For historical purposes, we have also put up a transcription of the minutes for Woodlands Association meetings from 1912-2017.



The focus on Timothy Mather Cooley last month brought to light some information about his brother James who is buried in a different fenced area of Woodlands Cemetery. James was an attorney and lived his entire life in Granville. He contributed not only his expertise but his time and talents in other aspects of the town. He was the town clerk for some 10 years and, like his brother Timothy, was dedicated in his documentation of on-going town happenings. Now, some 200 years later, we are grateful for that documentation. James married Almira Parsons in 1805 and together had 5

children. James built a small office that he used for a while as a residence until he built the larger house just to the west. It is the small historic building at 688 Main Road that became his Law Office. It originally had two front doors, one to the office, one to the living room and kitchen of the residence. It is still an active residence today. When James died in 1851, the little building became the Town Offices for a number of years. It was James and Almira's youngest son, James Parsons, who partnered with Silas Noble to start the Drum Shop.

The Granville Fire Department wants you to know about open burning!

Open Burning:

Each year between January 15th and May 1st some Massachusetts communities allow their residents to conduct open burning. It is important to remember that when open burning, you are subject to certain requirements and responsibilities issued and enforced by the State Fire Marshal's office, Department of Environmental Protection and your local Fire Department (310 CMR: DEP 7.07). These regulations are there for the safety of you and your neighbors as well as the protection of the environment. The Town of Granville permits open burning of brush with a permit from the Fire Department.

The Granville Fire Department will be issuing open burning permits between January 15th and April 31st. For more information on the permitting process, to obtain a permit, and brush burning regulations, visit the GFD Website at www.granvillefire.net.

Permitting process:

- Permits may be sought on line in advance of the day(s) you wish to burn
- There is no fee assessed for burning permits
- Permits may be revoked by the fire department at any time due to adverse weather or other concerns that are prohibitive to safe outdoor burning. A fire department official will contact all permit holders if it becomes necessary to cancel burning for a specific day.

 Permits may be issued as a hardcopy or electronically. You must keep your written permit and make it available to officials if necessary.

NOTE: The fire department is dispatched to all 911 reports of smoke or fire. The fire department response is only cancelled after an officer on scene confirms a permitted burn.

All open burning is to be conducted:

- From January 15th to May 1st of each year
- On land proximate to the place of generation
- At a location greater than 75 feet from any dwelling
- As not to create a nuisance
- Between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

The following is PROHIBITED under all circumstances:

- Burning of brush, trees, cane and driftwood from commercial or institutional land clearing operations
- Burning of grass, hay, leaves, and stumps
- Burning of tires
- Burning during adverse meteorological conditions
- Burning at landfills or refuse disposal facilities other than DEP approved incinerators
- Stacking, placing or storing combustible materials such that DEP may presume that it will be burned.
