WINTER ROADS POLICY 2019-2020
In effect from November 1 - to April 30

- On-street parking is prohibited. Vehicles will be towed at the owner's expense.
- Parking at the Town Hall, Library, or school is restricted to those doing Town business during business hours.
- During winter road operations, main roads are a priority.
- Town Roads with low use may be closed for the winter.
- Depositing snow on a Town road is prohibited.
- Plowing snow across a Town road is prohibited.
- "All season" tires are not a substitute for snow tires.
- High quality snow tires, preferably studded, are essential for winter driving.
- Limit travel during storm events.
- Drive below the posted speed.
- Be aware of changing road conditions, flurries, and frost. Shaded areas become hazardous rapidly. An isolated weather event will create hazardous conditions. Notorious for this are the Gorge and Hairpin Turn on Route 57, the North end of Old Westfield Road, and Water Street by the Transfer Station.

Winter Storm Policy

Property Damage During Winter Storms and Snow Removal Operations

WINTER STORM POLICY: Responsibility for Fixing/Replacing Roadside Mailboxes, Fences, and Landscaping.

This policy applies to all Granville residents.

Mailboxes, fences, and landscaping damaged by *snow* discharged from a snow plow will be the responsibility of the homeowner.

Mailboxes, fences, and landscaping damaged by contact with the *plow* will be repaired by the Highway Department.

The Highway Department will make repairs to mailboxes hit by the plow as soon as possible. Many mailboxes are closer to the pavement edge than recommended. Mailboxes that are in poor condition cannot with-stand heavy snow coming off a plow.

Mailboxes hit by contact with a plow will be repaired and the resident will receive an apology for the inconvenience.

How to stay safe this heating season...

Be aware of Carbon Monoxide (CO) dangers! CO is of particular concern during cold weather when doors and windows are closed, and heating appliances such as wood stoves and furnaces are in full operation. Here are some simple tips to keep you and your family safe:

- You cannot see or smell Carbon Monoxide. Working CO detectors are the only way to detect it in your home. You should have working CO alarms outside every sleeping area, and on every level of your home.
- CO alarms should be tested monthly. If it is a plug in type detector make sure it has a battery backup.
- If your CO alarm sounds, get outside to fresh air immediately and call 911. GFD will meter your home to ensure the air is safe.
- Operate portable generators outside, check

your furnace and fireplace for proper exhaust ventilation. Loose or broken pipes should be fixed immediately.

Heating Fire Facts - Heating caused nearly 10,000 fires in Massachusetts over the last five years. Heating is the second leading cause of home fires in the state.

- Have furnaces and chimneys checked by a professional every year before the start of the heating season. Fuel assistance programs can help homeowners with maintenance and repair costs.
- Wood, Pellet and Coal Stoves - These solid fuel stoves require a permit from the local building inspector to ensure they are installed safely and properly. Dispose of ashes in a metal container, with a lid, away from the house, garage, and porch.
- Space Heaters Need Space - Keep anything that can burn at least three feet away from space heaters.
- Unvented Kerosene Heaters Illegal in Massachusetts - Dangerous unvented kerosene heaters are illegal in Massachusetts, but they are still available in other states. They pose both fire and carbon monoxide risks.

Together, we can improve the life safety and well-being of our Granville residents!

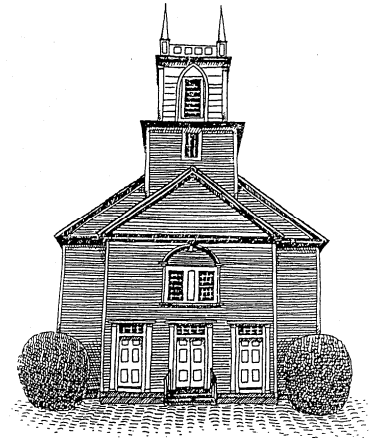

The cemetery has quieted down and will rest for the New England winter.

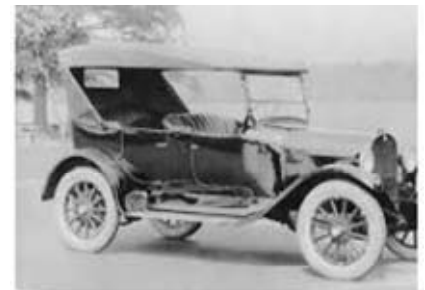


James Cooley Esq. (little saltbox law office on Main Road)had a son, James Parsons Cooley (of Noble and Cooley fame),..... who had a son, Ralph Brown Cooleywho purchased Granville's first automobile. It was an 1899

Locomobile. It was steam driven and touted to be noiseless, odorless, lightweight, able to travel up to 40 miles per hour and climb hills as steep as 36 degrees (think Granville). According to the documents on Granville's Historic Image Library, Ralph ordered it on August 1, 1899 with a \$200 deposit and a promised delivery date of September 15th. Delivery was delayed until late October and delayed again until mid-November. It was mistakenly shipped to Westfield, **CT** then from there to Westfield, MA arriving late November when actually Ralph had requested to pick it up personally in Newton, MA. For whatever reason, it spent a considerable amount of time stored in Brooklyn, NY. It was probably not especially good in the snow. It was built by the Stanley brothers of Newton, MA. The \$600 cost in 1899 is the equivalent of about \$18,181 today.



Granville's Harry Holcomb, described as a rider mechanic, was one of the first fatalities at the Indianapolis Speedway in 1909. He and driver Billy Bourque crashed and lost their lives in a 1908 Knox Model O. The Knox car was built in Springfield, MA.



1922 DODGE TOURING CAR

William Hansen owned a 1922 Dodge Touring which he used to carry Roberts Reunion members from the trolley stop in Tariffville to the reunion.



The Oleksaks owned a 1925 Buick at 522 Main Rd.

In 1931, Bill Kaynor purchased a 1924 Ford which was used as the Granville Center News "press vehicle" and had a few problems.

 J. Wright has hired Bill Kaynor's Bug, high-power Ford racing vehicle, for the remainder of the summer. The Editors rode successfully to Southwick to obtain a picture for today's issue last night, only the picture wasn't ready.
 The return up the Mile Hill was rendered somewhat difficult by a system of carburation which depends on Gravity. Having run out of Gravity, the rest of the trip had to be undertaken in reverse and sideways, to the discomfort of a couple of 10-ton trucks craving passage at the time. Still, she is one fine press car, and the Editors finally arrived laden down with hot items. The G.C.N. always comes through! Or does it?

In 1930, Gil Stevenson, the editor and publisher of the Granville Center News was still of a mind that steam was far superior to gasoline and wrote a lengthy article extolling the virtues of steam and the vices of gasoline (that article is available on the Image Library).

And in 1933, a Tolland man "soaring" downhill toward West Granville in a 1927 Buick Touring car, swerved to miss a dog, crashed through a fence and the Buick landed on its top. The right rear wheel was stripped off its spokes and the top was bashed in. "No one was badly hurt. The dog seemed to have gotten off ok and a pet rabbit

in the car was uninjured." .
 Gil Stevenson (editor, Granville

Center News) who loved steam eventually gave in to gasoline.

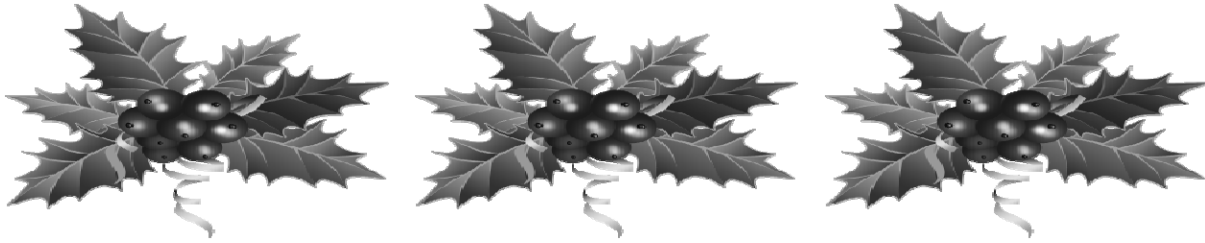

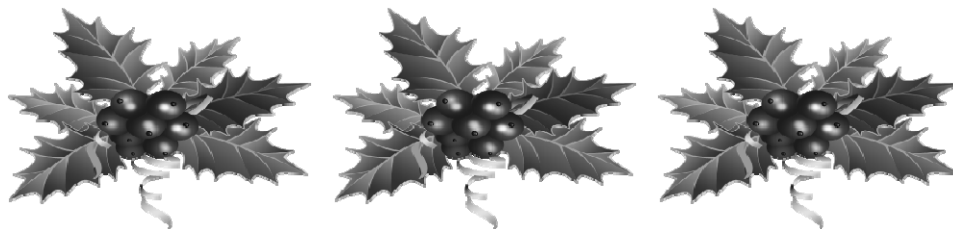
