Thanksgiving Fire Safety Tips!

Once again holiday season is upon us, and it is our job to keep you informed of the inherent risks that accompany each one. For November, we are going to cover the topic of Thanksgiving and the different fire hazards that we see year after year. However, before I get into each topic, I would like to start off by wishing the residents of Granville a wonderful and safe Thanksgiving. Now let us get into it:

Fire Safety Hazard #1: Cooking Fires

Cooking fires are the leading cause of injuries and property damage on Thanksgiving. Please see below for tips on how you can either prevent these fires or limit the damage they may cause.

Tip #1: Never leave food that is cooking unattended for long durations of time.

Tip #2: Keep flammable objects away from the stove when they are not in use.

Examples: Wooden Utensils, Oven Mitts, and towels or food packaging.

Tip #3: Should a grease fire occur, DO NOT USE WATER!

Grease fires can be extinguished simply by being smothered with a lid.

Tip #4: If you are deep frying a turkey, do it outside and away from your home or any other flammable objects.

Fire Safety Hazard #2: Burns

Burns are yet another hazard that we see an exponential rise in occurrence in during the holidays. Here are quick tips on preventing the chances of burns occurring during the holiday.

Tip #1: Keep children away from the stove or other cooking elements being used.

Tip #2: Be cautious of steam and splashing of boiling liquids.

Tip #3: Do not leave kids unattended in a room with a lit candle.

Fire Safety Hazard #3: Car Accidents

While not everyone travels during the holidays, we want those of you that do to be safe and avoid accidents and or injuries.

Tip #1: Do not text and drive. Distracted driving is a leading cause of car accidents and can easily be prevented by waiting until you arrive to where you are going. In the event of an emergency pull over to a safe location before using your phone.

Tip #2: Wear a seat belt. Seatbelts prevent major injuries and can even be life saving

Tip #3: Avoid driving under the influence. Drunk driving can not only create a dangerous situation for yourself, but it also puts any one around you at risk. Call a friend or family member to pick you up if you need a ride.

Quick General Tips:

Tip #1: Ensure smoke and CO detectors are in proper working order.

Tip #2: In the event of a fire, safely evacuate your house and ensure the door is closed behind you. This both contains the fire and can limit the damage it creates.
