Following this, a license is issued and you can be married any place in the Commonwealth. Your marriage license is filed at the Town Clerk's Office where the Marriage Intentions Form is completed. 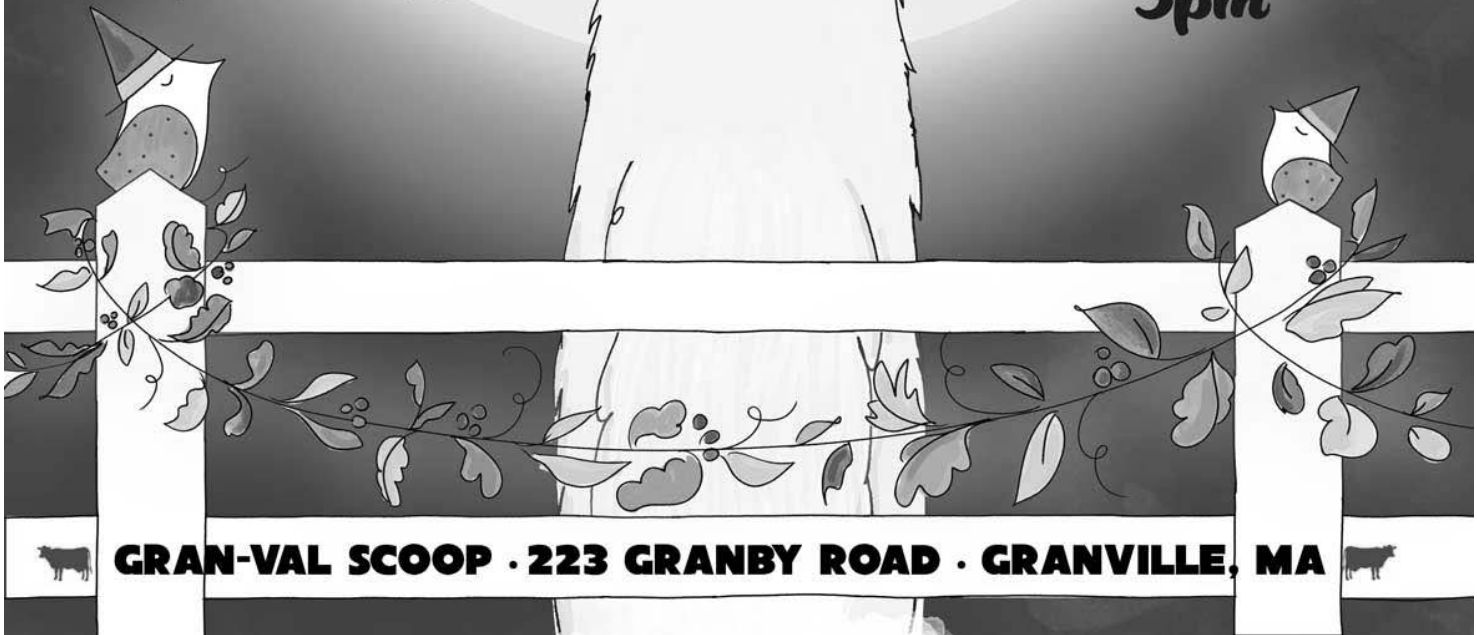
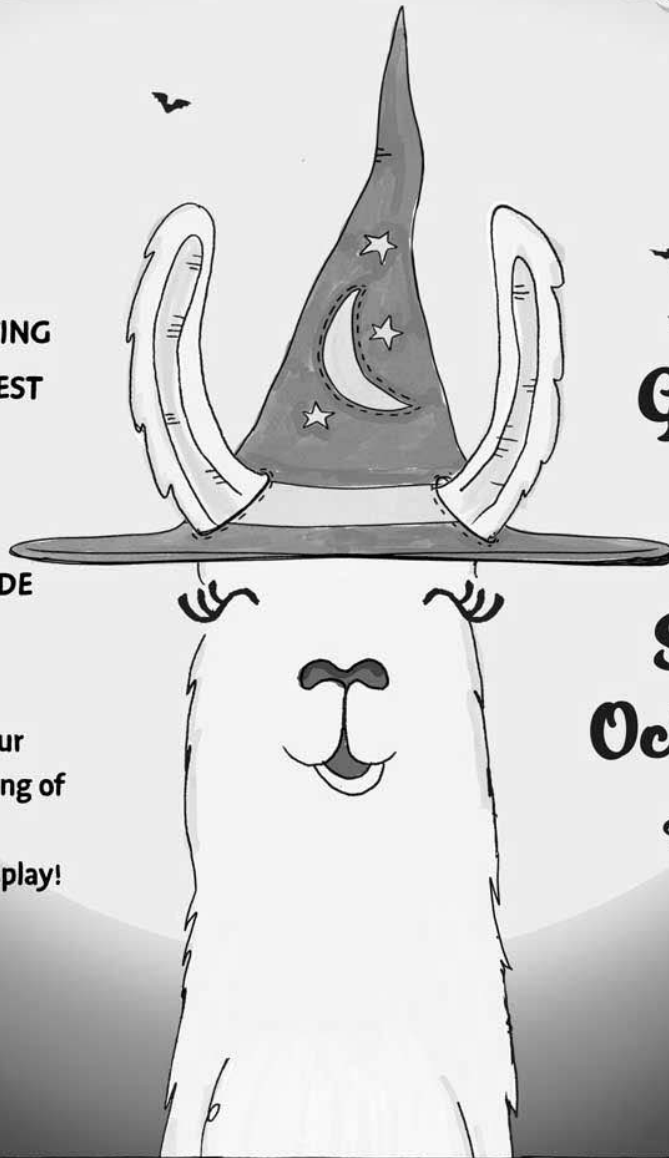

GRANVILLE FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Granville Fire Department & The American Red Cross are teaming up to install smoke alarms in Granville!

Smoke Alarm Facts:

Working smoke alarms give early warning of danger and are the single most important way to prevent fatal fires. They double the chances of surviving a fire.

Every second counts in a fire. Working smoke alarms provide residents with early warning of fire and allow residents to exit a home quickly. Working smoke alarms save lives.

You should have working smoke alarms on every level of your home, outside bedrooms, at the top of open stairs and at the base of cellar stairs.

Maintain smoke alarms. Test them once a month and change the batteries twice a year, unless they are the 10 year maintenance free type which do not require battery replacement but still require testing.

Smoke alarms must be replaced every 10 years. Alarms are labeled with their date of manufacture. If there is no label, they are older than 10 years and must be replaced.

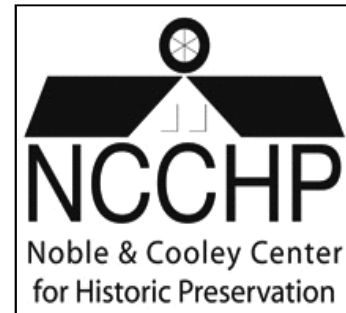
How GFD and The American Red Cross can help:

On Saturday November 9th, 2019, The GFD and The American Red Cross will be installing smoke alarms in the local area. You must contact GFD at (413) 357-8572, or visit our website www.granvillefire.net, no later than October 20th to provide your contact information (name and number) so we can schedule your appointment. You are eligible to have up to three alarms installed if:

- Your house was built before 1975, and
- You currently have no smoke alarms, or your current alarms are older than 10 years old

Together, we can improve the life safety and well-being of our Granville residents!

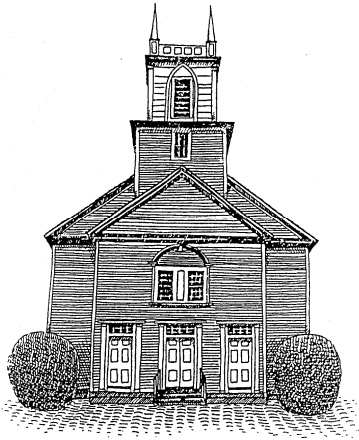
Granville Harvest Fair News: October 12 – 14 The museum will be open all three days of the fair for tours and exhibits. Watch our website for more info.

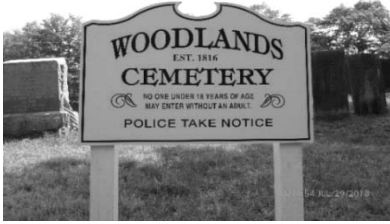

Woodlands Cemetery Update and History.



Welcome to October, a most beautiful time of year in our town. Glorious foliage and cool nights bring a promise of the winter to come.

We have begun work on identifying and documenting the residents of Northeast (Old Westfield Road) and Main Road cemeteries. This will continue over the winter.

For those who may have visited, or at least driven by Woodlands cemetery, you may have noticed the long, beautiful stone wall. It was built in the early 1900's, probably around 1912, about the time the Woodlands Association was formed. It is 218 feet long, 3 feet high, and 23 inches thick with a single 10 foot entrance. Mr. Charles M. Billings, a master stonemason from Southbridge, MA built it for a fee of \$300. The minutes of the Woodlands Association have the recollections of several young men, Stephen Roberts, Pearl Phelon and Edson Fielding, as they watched and sometimes helped Mr. Billings. They describe how a large boulder across the street from the cemetery was blasted to provide the smaller rocks for the wall, with Pearl and Edson moving the rocks across the street for use in the wall. Mr. Billings is described as not only an excellent stonemason but



also an impressive wood chopper who could chop wood with both hands. He lived to age 90. The wall was "finished" and gates added in 1918 for \$100.

The cemetery is home to many Granville residents. Not everyone was famous or had renowned contributions. Joseph and Mary Carney lived in Granville at the turn of the



century (1900). They both emigrated from Ireland in 1884. Joseph was 29 and Mary was 34. We haven't found yet

where they landed, whether it was Ellis Island or a different port of entry. However, they did live in Granville in 1892. The Valuation and Taxes document for Granville has them owning 1 poll, 3 swine, and 10 hens for a total value of \$22 and owing \$2.57 tax. A poll is a dehorned bovine and it seems that everyone was allowed at least one without being taxed for it.

The 1900 Federal Census says that John and Mary were married in 1884, the same year they immigrated. We don't know if they were married in Ireland, in the US, or perhaps on board ship. There is no record of children. Joseph died in 1909 and Mary in 1913 in Northampton. Their headstones are identical and modest

Granville CULTURAL COUNCIL SEEKS FUNDING PROPOSALS

Proposals for community-oriented arts, humanities, and science programs due October 15.

The Granville Cultural Council has set an October 15, deadline for organizations, schools, and individuals to apply for grants that support cultural activities in the community.

According to Council spokesperson these grants can support a variety of artistic projects and activities in Granville-- including exhibits, festivals, field trips, short-term artist residencies, or performances in schools, workshops, and lectures.

The Granville Cultural Council is part of a network of 329 Local Cultural Councils serving all 351 cities and towns in the Commonwealth. The LCC Program is the largest grassroots cultural funding network in the nation, supporting thousands of community-based projects in the arts, sciences and humanities every year. The state legislature provides an annual appropriation to the Mass Cultural Council, a state agency, which then allocates funds to each community.

This year, the Granville Cultural Council will distribute amount to be determined in grants.

Southwick Congregational Church will host their Annual Pumpkin Carving / Spaghetti Supper on Saturday October 26, 2019.

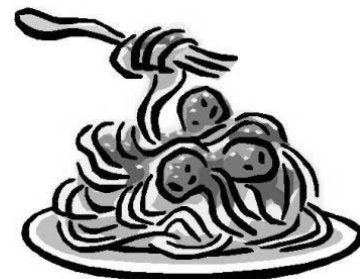
The menu will include pasta, homemade sauce & meatballs, salad, rolls and a few sweet treats.

Why? In Abraham Lincoln's First Inaugural Address in 1861, with the nation on the brink of civil war, he appealed to the "better angels of our nature". In our dangerously divided nation, we all need to be touched by something "better" within us and within the country we share.

Goals:

- To better understand the experiences and beliefs of those on the other side of the political divide.
- To see if there are areas of commonality, as well as differences.
- To learn something that might be helpful to others in our community and the nation.

The Process: The workshop is facilitated by two Better Angels-certified moderators who ensure a setting hospitable to red and blue participants alike. The focus is on listening and reflecting, rather than debating and persuading.

Requirements to participate:

- Be willing to listen to the "other side".
- Be willing to engage the "other side" in respectful conversation.

Requirements to observe:

- Not engage with participants, except during breaks and lunch.
- Commit to attend for the entire day.

What happens after the workshop? It's up to you! If you would like to keep the conversation going with folks from the other side and help to unify America, you'll have the opportunity to form a Better Angels Alliance in your community.
