Marriage Intentions

If you wish to marry, you can contact my office or any other Town Clerk in the Commonwealth. The first document that the couple must complete is the Marriage Intentions Form and both must be present at the same time to do so. Following this, a license is issued and you can be married any place in the Commonwealth. Your marriage license is filed at the Town Clerk's Office where the Marriage Intentions Form is completed. Justice of the Peace

If you are planning a wedding during 2019, you can contact me to act as your Justice/Wedding Celebrant for your civil ceremony.

Business Certificate:

What is a Business Certificate?

Commonly known as a "DBA" ("doing business as"), a Business Certificate creates a public record of the name and address of the owner(s) of a business. This also includes anyone operating any type of home-based business. Consumers are entitled to this information and it may not otherwise be readily available.

Who must file a Business Certificate?

Massachusetts General Law Chapter 110, §5 states that any person conducting business in the Commonwealth under any title other than the real name of the person conducting the business, whether individually or as a partnership, shall file a Business Certificate in the office of the Town Clerk of every city or town where an office of any such person or partnership may be situated.

Under Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 110, §6 a Business Certificate is not required if a corporation is doing business under any title which includes the true surname of any partner. Certain other associations and partnerships may also be exempt (refer to above citation for details.)

How do I file or renew a Business Certificate?

Forms are available by mail, on the town website, or in person. Each person named on the Business Certificate must either sign the form in person at the Town Clerk's Office or have their signature notarized on the form by a Notary Public. Filing a DBA does not protect your business name. The filing fee is \$30.00 and good for four years. Proper identification will be required.

Does the filing of a Business Certificate protect me from others using the same name?

No. The protection of a trademark (word, name, symbol or device) in Massachusetts is accomplished through the Secretary of State's Office.

CLERK'S CORNER CONTINUED

What if I discontinue or withdraw from the business or move to another location?

A Statement of Discontinuance, Change of Residence form must be completed and filed with the Town Clerk if one of the following occurs before the expiration (discontinuance or information change filing fee is \$10.00):

- Business is discontinued,
- One or more persons named on the certificate is withdrawn or retired from the business or partnership,
- Change of residence of one of the named persons on the certificate, or
- One or more of the persons named on the certificate dies.

Vital Records

Birth records are filed based on residence. If you are a resident of Granville at the time of the birth of your child, then the child's birth certificate will be filed in Granville. Death records are filed in the community in which you died. Certified copies of vital records (Birth, Marriage, Death) are \$10.00.



September – Trees, Shrubs and Flowers are in full growth – are they hiding anything?

Below are a few tips and reminders to help keep you and your family safe.

Seconds Count in an Emergency

- Protect your family and your property by having large visible house numbers.
- Firefighters, police officers, and paramedics find you faster when your home is properly marked.
- A visitor, child or injured person may be unable to give clear directions.
- Emergency personnel from a neighboring community may be unfamiliar with your area.

Use Large Visible Numbers

- Numbers need to be at least 4-inches in height and facing the street.
- Put the numbers under lighting, and use numbers with a contrasting background, so they will be visible at night.
- If your driveway is long, post your house number on both sides of a mailbox or sign pole at the end of the driveway near the road.
- Be sure to keep numbers visible by trimming trees, bushes and flowers.


Winter is Coming!

Woodlands Cemetery Update and History.



September brings blue skies, purple asters and a hint of beautiful foliage to accent our little country cemetery.

In the update category, Timothy Mather Cooley's fence has been repaired after having been hit by a vehicle in 2008. Plus we have a new welcome sign for the front gate and an "Information" box containing a list of graves with their GPS coordinates to aid visitors and family members.

Much of our history is preserved forever in Albion B. Wilson's *History of Granville, Massachusetts* published in 1954. Albion was born in 1872 in Weathersfield, VT, attended VT country schools,



Dartmouth College and Harvard Law. He then moved to Hartford, CT to practice law. He married Granville's Lavinia Rose, daughter of Miles J. Rose and Sophia Beach Rose. Lavinia graduated from Mt. Holyoke College in 1901, taught mathematics at Wilbraham Academy and was very involved in Granville's Library Club. For





albion B. Wilson

Albion, what started as curiosity about Granville's beginnings, developed into a

serious interest, and with extensive research, eventually resulted in a full-fledged published history of the town that they both loved. Lavinia saw to the publication of the book after his death in 1950.

The house where Lavinia grew up became the summer home of Albion and Lavinia where they lived 6 months of the year. It was built about 1880, purchased by Miles and Sophia Rose soon thereafter and is historically known as the Miles J. Rose house. Lavinia and Albion were married in the front bay window of the house. It is easily recognizable as the stately white home at 458 Main Road on the corner of Main and Old Westfield Roads. Lavinia continued to spend summers here for 18 years until 1968. The house



remained very much as it was when she was a child. There was minimal wiring, no insulation, no storm windows, no plumbing except for a hand pump in the rudimentary kitchen....and a 3-holer in the barn. When the Connors purchased it in 1969, they



had an historic house that was unblemished by generations of modifications. They had somewhat of a blank slate to work with and lots to do. It is now up to date and the Connors still live there.

Lavinia's parents: Miles J. Rose and Sophia Beach Rose.





Miles, Sophia, Albion and Lavinia are buried at Silver St. Cemetery.

Information and photos are credited to Granville Library's Historic Image Library and Merrilee and Jim Connors. The Library has a link to the on-line full text of Albion B. 
